Welcome to year five of Major Arena Soccer League 3, and the second season since the combination of MASL 3 and the Premier Arena Soccer League prior to the 2024-25 season.

A total of 13 teams are back from the 2024-25 season, with some new faces, old faces, and new faces in old places making up the 20-team league. In total, MASL 2, MASL 3 and MASL, W, the foundation of the North American's premier pro



indoor soccer pyramid, the 2025-26 season will feature 70 teams in three different countries. Including the top of the pyramid – the Major Arena Soccer League – no less than 78 teams will be playing under the MASL banner this winter.

Returning are the league champions – the RGV Barracudas out of Brownsville, Texas – who ended the three-year title run of Northern Virginia FC.

New teams this season in the Atlantic Division include Cumberland Valley SC, the Maryland Storm (who will play where the DMV Gunners played for the last two seasons) and Delaware City FC who will play of of the state's capital Wilmington.

All four teams in the East – the Roc City Boom who played RGV in the championship game – along with Buffalo, Cleveland and Youngstown are all back this year. New to the Great Lakes North Division this year are the Muskegon Risers, but they are far from new to the MASL. They have for the last

eight seasons fielded a team in MASL 2, and are stepping down a level in 2025-26. Also back in the pyramid are Cincinnati Swerve while Detroit Waza Flo and Indiana United both return.

The five-team South Division will feature four teams returning from last season including the OKC Certified Lions, who will play in the brand-new 4,500 seat OG&E Coliseum in downtown Oklahoma City this winter. Also back in 2025-26: RGV, the Wichita Selection and Springfield Demize. New is The Bold Dream FC based in Austin and Deportivo Shaolin.

Each MASL 3 team plays a 10-game regular season schedule, with a national playoffs to conclude the year.

- >> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams.
 >>: THE SKINNY: The East division is the last of the MASL 3 divisions to kick off in 2025-26, and will do so in a Battle of Lake Erie as the Gunners play out of Buffalo. The teams played two times last year, when the Samba went 6-4 with a goal differential of +12. The Gunners were 2-8 with a goal differential of -78. Cleveland won in Buffalo, 18-8, in the final game of the regular season for both teams. Earlier in the year, Cleveland won at home by a 23-9 count, led by Nick Zegarac who had six goals.
- >> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Nick Zegarac, besides his big outing against Buffalo, finished the season with 11 total points in just three games. Michael Schmid was their leading scorer with 11 goals and six assists in seven games, better than a two-points per game average.

Matiki, as he is known (Matiki Rehani Mwibeleca) was a superstar player at North High in Akron where he holds the school record for goals in one season and goals for his career, and was the 2025 OPVL Offensive Player of the Year for the Ambassadors FC ... Douglass Tshibuyi was a one-man scoring machine for Buffalo last year, scoring 43 goals to lead the league in just 10 games. He also added eight assists.

BALTIMORE KINGS at VIRGINIA MARAUDERS

- >> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: Baltimore defeated Northern Viginia back on Nov. 15 in Baltimore with Pat Flemming getting three goals and one assist and Josh Danza three assists for the Kings.
- >> THE SKINNY: The Marauders are coming off maybe their best performance in their four-year MASL 3 history, taking the three-time league champion Northern Virginia FC right to the wire before falling last weekend 12-10. The game was tied heading into the fourth quarter. The Kings and NOVA FC are the two teams that have played all five seasons of MASL 3 soccer, and are the most veteran team in the league with virtually their entire 2024-25 roster returning for this season.
- >> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Josh Danza continues to set the pace league wide as a premier playmaker for Baltimore (3-0). All seven of his team-high seven points have been assists. Tony Araviakis continues to be a deadly finisher, with six goals in three starts. For Virginia, they got a huge effort from one of their best, Bethson Fuentes, who had five goals and one assist in the recent loss to NOVA FC. Matthew Martinez was also a big contributor in that game with two goals and two assists.

- >> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between these two teams. THE SKINNY: On paper, this is a pretty enticing matchup with two first-year teams that have put together local and talented rosters with both making early statements in the very competitive Atlantic Division. CVSC comes in at 0-2, but both losses were down-to-the-wire affairs with the hugely more experienced Baltimore Kings, who won their games by just one and two goals. Meanwhile, Delaware City has put up no less than 12 goals in all three of their games, two of which were wins including a 20-3 win over the Maryland Storm, avenging a 12-10 loss to the Storm earlier in the season.
- >> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Luis Flores made his DCFC debut last weekend in the win over Maryland, and scored six goals and added four assists. Odell Johnson and Kel Ordonez each have nine points in three starts. Johnson has seven goals and Ordonez five ... For Cumberland Valley, MASL veteran Joel Musa has been an expected offensive leader, with two goals and three assists so far. Marcos Garcia and Erick Villatoro each have scored twice as well in two starts.

- >> THE SKINNY: The Swerve will just be happy to get a match in after two different attempts on different weekends to host the Muskegon Risers. Both games were snowed out with

treacherous travel conditions due to major winter storms. So for both teams – who both have a long and successful history of indoor soccer action – this will be the season opener. Detroit Waza Flo dates back to its founding in 2008

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Sam Fiore is a key veteran to help bring the younger Swerve players along. He played his college soccer at Xavier and at Wayne High School. He has appeared in games in both the PASL and MASL indoors and will also serve on the team's coaching staff this season ... Andrej Novakovic is another indoor veteran that will be asked to be a leader. Dangerous offensive threat, led the Swerve in points in the 2021-22 PASL season ... Eddie Zavala played collegiately at Cincinnati State and the University of Pikeville. Played in 23 games for UPIKE, with five points. Native of Maysville, Kentucky. For Waza Flo, Omar Lahbiki played collegiatey at Cleary University and Muskingum University. He also appeared in four games for the MASL San Diego Sockers in 2024-25.

Aboubakr Diallo scored five goals to lead the attack.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Aboubakr Diallo was a standout last year for OKC as well. He scored 25 goals and added 17 assists in nine games in 2024–25. Michael Chavez is another offensive threat to keep an eye one after scorning a hat trick in the opener.
