MAJOR ARENA SOCCER LEAGUE



Welcome to year five of Major Arena Soccer League 3, and the second season since the combination of MASL 3 and the Premier Arena Soccer League prior to the 2024-25 season.

A total of 13 teams are back from the 2024-25 season, with some new faces, old faces, and new faces in old places making up the 20-team league. In total, MASL 2, MASL 3 and MASL, W, the foundation of the North American's premier pro indoor soccer pyramid, the 2025-26 season will feature 70 teams in three different countries. Including the top of the pyramid – the Major Arena Soccer League – no less than 78 teams will be playing under the MASL banner this winter.



Returning are the league champions – the RGV Barracudas out of Brownsville, Texas – who ended the three-year title run of Northern Virginia FC.

New teams this season in the Atlantic Division include Cumberland Valley SC, the Maryland Storm (who will play where the DMV Gunners played for the last two seasons) and Delaware City FC who will play of of the state's capital Wilmington.

All four teams in the East – the Roc City Boom who played RGV in the championship game – along with Buffalo, Cleveland and Youngstown are all back this year. New to the Great Lakes North Division this year are the Muskegon Risers, but they are far from new to the MASL. They have for the last

eight seasons fielded a team in MASL 2, and are stepping down a level in 2025-26. Also back in the pyramid are Cincinnati Swerve while Detroit Waza Flo and Indiana United both return.

The five-team South Division will feature four teams returning from last season including the OKC Certified Lions, who will play in the brand-new 4,500 seat OG&E Coliseum in downtown Oklahoma City this winter. Also back in 2025-26: RGV, the Wichita Selection and Springfield Demize. New is The Bold Dream FC based in Austin and Deportivo Shaolin.

Each MASL 3 team plays a 10-game regular season schedule, with a national playoffs to conclude the year.

>> GAME RECAP: Don't need no stinkin' Super Bowl for entertainment when the Demize and Deportivo Shaolin get together for a weekend doubleheader in the Show Me State. The two teams did just that, combining for 47 goals over two games, and none did more showing that Shaolin's Daniel Malhue, who scored 10 goals – five in each game – to help his club to a thrilling sweep. On Saturday, when Julian Campos scored with just over nine minutes to play in the first half, Shaolin took a lead they never lost. They eventually went up 9-4, but Springfield twice whittled the deficit to just one goal in the final two quarters but never did find an equalizer. Springfield held a 26-22 advantage in shots on goal with Jason Coronado getting the win. Daniel Garcia and Weverson Rubim also had big nights for Shaolin with four goals each while Campos ended the night with a pair. For the Demize, Leonardo Borges had the hat trick and Gage Vehr scored two. On Sunday, things were even tighter. Three different Demize players all scored twice: Tyrell Phinn, Joe Loughnane and Hunter Gilliam. Leonel Palma had a goal and two assists for Deportivo, while Rubim had two goals and one assist. Leonel Espinoza chilled in with a goal and one assist as well for Shaolin.
