Welcome to year five of Major Arena Soccer League 3, and the second season since the combination of MASL 3 and the Premier Arena Soccer League prior to the 2024-25 season.

A total of 13 teams are back from the 2024-25 season, with some new faces, old faces, and new faces in old places making up the 20-team league. In total, MASL 2, MASL 3 and MASL, W, the foundation of the North American's premier pro



indoor soccer pyramid, the 2025-26 season will feature 70 teams in three different countries. Including the top of the pyramid – the Major Arena Soccer League – no less than 78 teams will be playing under the MASL banner this winter.

Returning are the league champions – the RGV Barracudas out of Brownsville, Texas – who ended the three-year title run of Northern Virginia FC.

New teams this season in the Atlantic Division include Cumberland Valley SC, the Maryland Storm (who will play where the DMV Gunners played for the last two seasons) and Delaware City FC who will play of of the state's capital Wilmington.

All four teams in the East – the Roc City Boom who played RGV in the championship game – along with Buffalo, Cleveland and Youngstown are all back this year. New to the Great Lakes North Division this year are the Muskegon Risers, but they are far from new to the MASL. They have for the last

eight seasons fielded a team in MASL 2, and are stepping down a level in 2025-26. Also back in the pyramid are Cincinnati Swerve while Detroit Waza Flo and Indiana United both return.

The five-team South Division will feature four teams returning from last season including the OKC Certified Lions, who will play in the brand-new 4,500 seat OG&E Coliseum in downtown Oklahoma City this winter. Also back in 2025-26: RGV, the Wichita Selection and Springfield Demize. New is The Bold Dream FC based in Austin and Deportivo Shaolin.

Each MASL 3 team plays a 10-game regular season schedule, with a national playoffs to conclude the year.

>> GAME RECAP: What a difference a couple of weeks can make. Maryland debuted with a 12-10 win at Delaware City back on November 29. But this weekend, the Storm had a very short bench with several injured players unable to dress, mostly notably Drew Wivell who had five goals for Maryland in their road win. This time, it was Luis Flores who stole the offensive spotlight with six goals and four assists. Odell Johnson, Carlos Lievano and Kel Ordonez each had three goals and one assist and while teammate Chris Morales had a goal and three assists. Jason D'addario had two of Maryland's three goals.

>> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first game of the season between the two teams. It was originally scheduled to be played Nov. 29 in Cincinnati, but was postponed because of treacherous driving conditions due to a major Midwest snow storm.

THE SKINNY: Muskegon, a long time fixture in MASL 2, moves down to MASL 3 for the 2025-26 season, and will be an immediate threat in the Great Lakes North. The Swerve also provide a great test; the club dates back to 2015. These two teams played against each other MASL 2 in the 2021-22 season. They met three times, with the Risers taking all three,

including one in overtime, 7-6. They also won by scores of 15-7 and 6-5 in regulation time.
>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: In MASL 2 last season, Cam Will was an offensive standout, scoring 22 goals and adding nine assists in his first year for Muskegon ... Longtime Riser Miguel Flores had 14 goals, and in his career in Muskegon, which started with the 2020-21 season, he has 39 regular season games with 69 goals scored and 86 total points ... Taylor Pill was second on the team in goals with 17, and had a team best 11 assists. In three years for Muskegon, Pill has appeared in 30 games with 35 goals and 13 assists. .. Sam Fiore is a key veteran to help bring the younger Swerve players along. He played his college soccer at Xavier and at Wayne High School. He has appeared in games in both the PASL and MASL indoors and will also serve on the team's coaching staff this season ... Andrej Novakovic is another indoor veteran that will be asked to be a leader. Dangerous offensive threat, led the Swerve in points in the 2021-22 PASL season ... Eddie Zavala played collegiately at Cincinnati State and the University of Pikeville. Played in 23 games for UPIKE, with five points. Native of Maysville, Kentucky.
