Welcome to year five of Major Arena Soccer League 3, and the second season since the combination of MASL 3 and the Premier Arena Soccer League prior to the 2024-25 season.

A total of 13 teams are back from the 2024-25 season, with some new faces, old faces, and new faces in old places making up the 20-team league. In total, MASL 2, MASL 3 and MASL, W, the foundation of the North American's premier pro



indoor soccer pyramid, the 2025-26 season will feature 70 teams in three different countries. Including the top of the pyramid – the Major Arena Soccer League – no less than 78 teams will be playing under the MASL banner this winter.

Returning are the league champions – the RGV Barracudas out of Brownsville, Texas – who ended the three-year title run of Northern Virginia FC.

New teams this season in the Atlantic Division include Cumberland Valley SC, the Maryland Storm (who will play where the DMV Gunners played for the last two seasons) and Delaware City FC who will play of of the state's capital Wilmington.

All four teams in the East – the Roc City Boom who played RGV in the championship game – along with Buffalo, Cleveland and Youngstown are all back this year. New to the Great Lakes North Division this year are the Muskegon Risers, but they are far from new to the MASL. They have for the last

eight seasons fielded a team in MASL 2, and are stepping down a level in 2025-26. Also back in the pyramid are Cincinnati Swerve while Detroit Waza Flo and Indiana United both return.

The five-team South Division will feature four teams returning from last season including the OKC Certified Lions, who will play in the brand-new 4,500 seat OG&E Coliseum in downtown Oklahoma City this wintr. Also back in 2025-26: RGV, the Wichita Selection and Springfield Demize. New is The Bold Dream FC based in Austin and Deportivo Shaolin.

Each MASL 3 team plays a 10-game regular season schedule, with a national playoffs to conclude the year.

>>PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams. >> THE SKINNY: Each team will be looking for their first win of 2025-26 as both are 0-1. RGV, the defending MASL 3 champs, fell in OKC against the Certified Lions, and in fact, Austin's The Bold Dream's only start was a loss in OKC as wellm and by strikingly similar score lines. The Lions defeated the Barracudas 13-4 and Austin 14-4

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Austin got two goals each in their first game in the MASL from Jacob Powell and Damian Peregrina, who played his high school soccer at Hays High in Buda, Texas. RGV got two goals from Jamie Ochoa in their opener. Marco Don Juan had a goal and one assist, and in five career regular season MASL 3 starts, has four goals and seven assists. In the team's three playoff wins last season, he totaled five points as well.

- >>PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams. >> THE SKINNY: There might not be a division in the entirety of MASL soccer that has more firepower than the East Division of MASL 3. The Gunners live up to their nickname game in and game out, but are just one game into the season, that a 22-10 loss to the Cleveland Samba on the road. Youngstown will try to keep up as this is their season-opener. In 2024-25, the Gunners were 2-8 and surrendered 165 goals, most in the league. Youngstown was also 2-8 with 129 goals allowed.
- >> PLAYERS TO WATCH: The Gunners have one of the best finishers in the league in Douglass Tshibuyi who led the league in goals last year and had four in his first game of 2025–26 ... Ali Shawish had a big opening night as well with three goals and two assists ... Skyler Surckla was one of the Hawks big offensive threat last year. He is a 2013 graduate of Newbury High School where he was a four year letter winner for the Black Knights. He was a 2013 first team Chagrin Valley All-Conference, and second team Grater Cleveland honoree. Hep layed club soccer for AC Premier and Olympic Development Program, including trips to play in France, Holland and Germany.


>> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams.
>> THE SKINNY: Hopefully the scoreboard operator is in good shape, because it's likely he'll get quite a workout in this one between two teams that light up the scoreboard. Cleveland scored 22 in its season opening win over the Sahara Gunners, and last year pounded in 105 goals. That was nothing, however, compared to Rochester's 177. This is the season opener for the Boom, who lost in the MASL 3 finals last year to the RGV Barracudas.
>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Cleveland got five goals from Mikey Schmid in their opener, and another four off the foot of Conner Hollett. Roc City has a bunch of MASL familiar names, starting with Jake Schindler who as played in 207 MASL games with the Rochester Lancers, Syracuse Silver Knights, Utica City, Florida Tropics and Baltimore Blast. >>PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams. >> THE SKINNY: The Storm come in at 2-1 having won their last outing 14-9 over Cumberland Valley. They also have a 12-10 win over Delaware City, who also defeated them in Wilmington when the Storm played with a very short bench, 20-3. Northern Virginia was the three-time MASL 3 champions until last year when they were replaced by RGV. This is only their second start, and they had to work hard for their first win, a 12-10 final against the Virgina Marauders.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Johnny De Souza burst on the scene with a huge opening night performance, in on eight of his team's 12 goals. He scored three himself and assisted on five others. Jean Phillipe is a veteran of the MASL pyramid, and he scored three times in the win over Virginia. Angel Stanley Maravilla Chavez is off to a strong start for Maryland, and look out for Drew Wivell if he is able to go. He is nursing an ankle injury, so he's only played once for the Storm in their season opener, but he scored five times.

>>PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the second meeting of the season with Cincinnati having a 12-1 win on their ledger back in mid December in the season opener for both sides. Nathan Neal led the charge with four goals for Cincy. Shawn Lamar and Jacob Pokorski each scored twice. Alex Pinkney was the winning goaltender. Dominic Scicluna got the lone Detroit score.

>> THE SKINNY: Cincinnati has only played once, with two postponements already because of sever winter weather in the Midwest which made travel difficult. These two teams are long time rivals, having played against each other in different leagues and different iterations. Detroit was a very solid 7-3 in MASL 3 play last year, with a goal differential of zero, having both scored and given up 55 goals in their 10 starts.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Sam Fiore is a key veteran to help bring the younger Swerve players along. He played his college soccer at Xavier and at Wayne High School. He has appeared in games in both the PASL and MASL indoors and will also serve on the team's coaching staff this season ... Andrej Novakovic is another indoor veteran that will be asked to be a leader. Dangerous offensive threat, led the Swerve in points in the 2021-22 PASL season ... Eddie Zavala played collegiately at Cincinnati State and the University of Pikeville.

Played in 23 games for UPIKE, with five points. Native of Maysville, Kentucky. For Waza Flo, Omar Lahbiki played collegiatey at Cleary University and Muskingum University. He also appeared in four games for the MASL San Diego Sockers in 2024–25.
