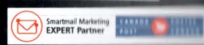

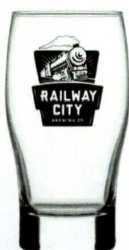

Historic IBL Championship Trophy Resurfaces after 63 Years

The London Majors' Alumni Association has found the Intercounty Baseball League Championship Trophy that was in use by the IBL from 1920-1956. The London Majors were the last IBL team to win this championship trophy in 1956.

Thanks to historian Stephen Harding's contacts, Sandy Wagter ~ a niece of Canadian Baseball Hall-of-Famer Frank Colman and daughter of Jack Colman, co-owners of the London Majors from 1956 to early 1960 ~ donated the historic trophy to the London Majors' Alumni Association on April 3, 2019, hoping it can be put on public display at Labatt Park.

"The trophy was in my mother's basement for years, then she passed away in 1990," says Sandy Wagter, "so I took the trophy because I've always been interested in the history side of baseball at Labatt Park. I remember working in the small concession booth near the clubhouse when my father and uncle had the team. Later, I was a pitcher in one of the ladies' city leagues."

Alumni chairperson Barry Boughner, who loves discovering London Majors and IBL history, says "It's incredible the trophy has resurfaced after 63 years. It's called the Ontario Cup but it's the IBL Championship trophy sponsored by the Ontario Auto Spring & Supply Company in Guelph, Ontario."


Since 1992, the IBL Championship Trophy has been the Jack and Lynne Dominico Trophy. Prior to that, from 1957 to 1991, it was known as the Carling Red Cap Cup.

Frank and Jack Colman's London Majors won the Sr. IBL Championship in 1956, then competed in the Great Lakes-Niagara District Baseball League for one season in 1957 and won that championship as well before returning to the Sr. IBL in 1958. Why the trophy remained in London after 1956 and why London left the IBL for a season in 1957, remain mysteries.

Guelph won the IBL Championship as the Guelph Partridge Rubber Company in 1919 ~ the IBL's first year of operation ~ with Guelph repeating as champions in 1920 as the Guelph Spring and Axle Company and again in 1921 as the Guelph Maple Leafs.

The London Braves won the IBL Championship in 1925 (London's first year in the IBL), the London Winery won the IBL Championship in 1936, the London Silverwoods won the title in 1937, the London Army won it in 1943 and the London Majors won the cup in 1944, 1945, 1947, 1948, 1951 and 1956. All championship teams are documented on the 1920-1956 IBL Trophy.

2008 Pennant-Winning Majors Were Loaded with Talent

- > The 2008 London Majors won the John Coppes Memorial Trophy with the best win-loss record of 27-9 during the regular season (a .750 winning percentage). London's first pennant since 1988.
- > Majors' RHP Josh Palmer, 22, won the 2008 Ted Earley Memorial Trophy with the lowest ERA during the regular season (2.14). His record was 8-0, pitching seven complete games.
- > IBL All-Stars were: Majors' SS David Narodowski, RHP Josh Palmer, 1B Jess Bechard, OF Christian Riuz and MGR Roop Chanderdat.
- > Majors' SS David Narodowski was named MVP of the 2008 IBL All-Star Game in Toronto.
- > Majors' Co-owners Scott Dart and Roop Chanderdat won the David E. Hastings Trophy as IBL Co-executives of the Year.
- > In Game 7 of the best-of-seven-game championship series at Labatt Park, the Brantford Red Sox defeated the London Majors 8-2, before a sold-out crowd of 5,200.
- > Majors' INF Jeff Helps won the Max Roseman Memorial Trophy as the MVP during the IBL Playoffs.

Remembering the Season

Jeff Helps, 2B and SS

"It was a summer of memories. The players were a great group of guys; the one's you wanted on your team. We had bulldogs on the mound, matched with good defense and good hitting.

"Roop was in his 3rd season as the manager and he was good at communicating with the players. I always knew where I stood with Roop, what his expectations were and what my role was. He put all the pieces together and let us play."

On winning the IBL Playoff MVP Award (Jeff batted .408 with 29 hits), Helps reflects: "It was a team effort. The guys would always work out together and talk hitting. Mentoring from Jess Bechard helped me understand myself and helped me turn a corner."

"2008 was bitter-sweet. It was more than just the playoff run. It became a part of my life. Without that summer, I don't meet former Major Leaguer Adam Stern, owner of Centrefield Sports, where I now work. I wouldn't have set up in London. It was kind of like the stars aligned.

"The season was special; you're playing baseball at a good level and seeing the big playoff crowds made it great. Either being booed or cheered, it didn't matter, it was a great experience."

Kyle Piowarczyk, 3B

"My memories of the 2008 season began the same as most, with a lot of new faces. There was always turnover from year to year when I played. And you never really knew what kind of team you had until you got onto the field.

"In '08, you could see early on that we had a special group; really good players and really great guys. I can't remember having any problems of any kind with anyone. There were no egos to navigate around and the leadership that guys like Jess Bechard and Kevin Virtue provided kept everyone in check and moving towards the common goal.

"In '08, you could see early on that we had a special group; really good players and really great guys. I can't remember having any problems of any kind with anyone. There were no egos to navigate around and the leadership that guys like Jess Bechard and Kevin Virtue provided kept everyone in check and moving towards the common goal.

"One thing I do remember that summer is winning a lot of one-run games in late innings. We were always confident that someone would step up with a big hit and our pitching staff always gave us the chance to win. We were 2nd in the league in team hitting and defense and our pitching was the best in the league.

"There were a lot of capable players that accepted their roles and contributed whenever given the chance. No matter what our lineup looked like, we felt we had a chance to win.

"As is the case with most successful teams, we had team chemistry and fun off the field. We had guys from different backgrounds, different ages and guys that were there for different reasons, but in the clubhouse everyone connected ... Our clubhouse manager Cam (Snacks) Simpson made sure the guys had everything needed before, during and after games.

"Scott Dart was always close by to make sure the players had everything needed to be successful. He did a lot of behind-the-scenes work, that most fans aren't aware of.

"Of course, the unfortunate end of the summer is something I will never forget. I had to leave during the championship series against Brantford to fulfill my first professional hockey contract in Germany. An extremely difficult position to be in, but it was an opportunity I simply couldn't afford to jeopardize. There is no feeling in the world worse for me than not being beside your teammates in competition. However, I was extremely proud of how we competed and coming up short is nothing to be ashamed of. It's fair to say that 2008 was my most memorable as a London Major."

Jess Bechard, 1B and 3B

"I'd played off and on in a few leagues in Ohio but when I moved back to Canada in 2007, I hadn't thought about putting the spikes on again. One day, the itch just hit me and two days later I was at practice with the team. It immediately felt like a great fit. I was really just looking to have some fun and to be totally honest, my motivation was I wanted to prove to myself that I could still play at a high level. It turned out to be more fun than I ever imagined.

"Getting off to a hot start in the IBL regular season can give you some breathing room for later in the season when teams are fighting for playoff position, so our strong start played a big part in helping us win the pennant ... It became evident that the key to the team being a close-knit group was Kyle Piwowarczyk. 'Peo' was one of the greatest teammates I ever stepped on a field with and a good friend to this day.

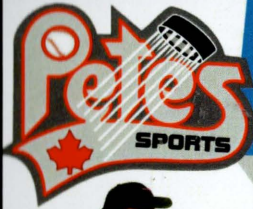
"The biggest addition was Jeff Helps, who came about eight games into the season. He was the final piece of the puzzle and we just kept rolling. We now had a lineup where you could put the same starting nine out there each night and let the players go after it. I think Roop knew that he had something special and let us have fun and play and Roop did a great job of that. He had a professional infield [Piwowarczyk 3B, Narodowski SS, Helps 2B] and an outfield of talented athletes [Vallejos LF, Ruiz CF, Virtue RF]. Every night we stepped on the field expecting to win and we knew we had the team to do it.

"The pitching staff might have been even more impressive. We had two veterans in Adam Echlin and Josh Palmer who you knew were going to give you a chance to win each time they took the rubber. They were going to go deep in games and give the bullpen a rest when you needed a shutdown outing.

"While one of the storylines of the playoffs is the fact that we lost the left side of our infield for the Brantford series [Piwowarczyk to Germany for pro hockey and Narodowski to start his school year at the University of Kansas], it's more important to focus on the guys who stepped up and filled the vacated roles ... Moving Jeff Helps to SS to cover for Narodowski was seamless. Helps is arguably the smoothest infielder I've ever played with.

"In my opinion, the hero of that series was Vince Burke. He jumped in at second base and played like an all-star that whole series. Vince was a solid player all season and an unbelievable teammate.

"With Josh Palmer starting in game 7, we felt pretty good about our chances. Long story short, we lost ... but the effort we put in and the team that came together to overcome obstacles was really impressive. Not winning game 7 doesn't change how I feel about that team. We gave Brantford everything they could handle. They were a veteran team who had to fly in every weapon under the sun to beat us. We danced with the ones who brought us and we went down fighting."

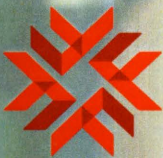

The London Majors' Alumni Association was established in the spring of 2017 to connect players and families from all eras.

Barry Boughner, chair of the Majors' Alumni, says that Labatt Park was once the meeting place for retired Majors when 20 or 30 guys would show up at the park to shoot the breeze and catch up. Too many of these get-togethers took place when they were mourning the loss of a former coach, manager or player.

When former coach and London Sports Hall of Famer Norm Aldridge died at age 90 on July 15, 2015, Norm's teammates got together to remember him.

Norm's son, Scott Aldridge, remembers going through his father's collection of team memorabilia and finding a Rogers-TV video clip of a June 1994 game at Labatt Park between the St. Thomas Elgins and the Majors on Eager Beaver Baseball Night.

"Quite a few of the ghosts of Labatt Park are alive and well in that tape," says Aldridge.

Norm & Gabby Inspired Majors' Alumni...continued.

"Roy McKay, #16, Dad, #3 and Gabby Anderson, #5, are three of them."

That videotape got him thinking about organizing events to celebrate Majors' history and past accomplishments.

Another loss was the catalyst to make it happen. When Stan (Gabby) Anderson, another London Sports Hall of Famer, died at 87 on June 7, 2016, "many former players and ball staff attended" says Aldridge. It was then the "idea of doing something for the living" was born. Aldridge says organizing events at the park and honouring players go hand-in-hand: "When the living are gathered, the dead will also be remembered."

Barry Boughner was the perfect guy to pull it all together. Boughner, called "a force of nature" by retired Free Press sportswriter Morris Dalla Costa, had played for the London Juniors, London Pontiacs, Avcos and Majors on and off between 1966 and 1984.

He remains in touch with many of his former hockey and baseball teammates and had recently organized a reunion at Budweiser Gardens. In 2015, Boughner brought former hockey teammates from all over the USA and Canada for the 50th anniversary of the London Nationals, London's first Junior 'A' hockey club.

Along with Majors' alumni Scott Aldridge, Wayne Fenlon, Dave Byers, Alex McKay, Jon Owen, Arden Eddie and Barry Wells from the Friends of Labatt Park, they got things rolling. With an eye to developing an annual "Alumni Day," the group's first meeting was at Dave Byers' house.

For the first Alumni Day on July 22, 2017, they filled the Roy McKay Clubhouse with historical baseball displays. Past players and today's fans arrived in droves despite the lousy weather, before the Brantford Red Sox-London game. Majors' management even flew in Ted Giannoulas, the San Diego Chicken, who'd worked as a kid changing the old manual scoreboard at Labatt Park for 25 cents a game in the late 1960s. An on-field presentation recognized former catchers Stan (Tubby) Jones and Jack Fairs, former pitcher Barry Moore, former shortstop Bob Deakin and former owner-player-manager Arden Eddie.

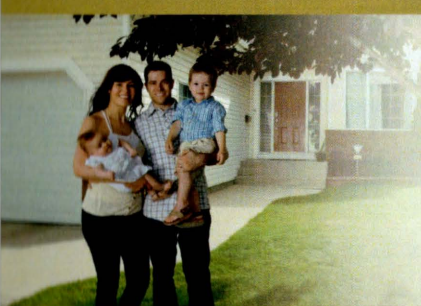
Whether attending meetings, setting up clubhouse displays, organizing on-field presentations, posting team photos on the Majors' website, Facebook and Twitter, hunting for old newspaper clippings at the Central Library, the Majors' Alumni executive continues to generate interest in their Intercounty Baseball League ball club, which dates back to 1925.

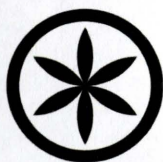
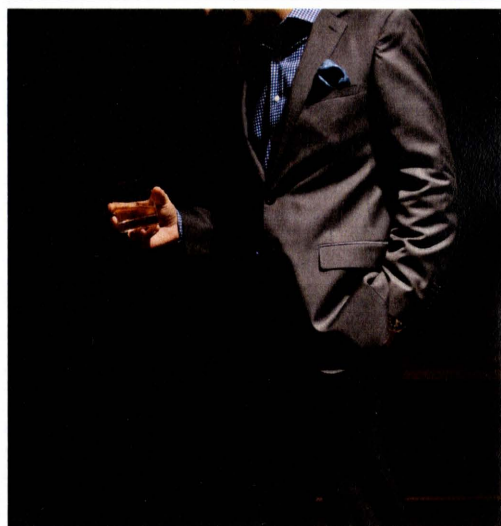

A London Tradition Since 1925



The Intercounty Baseball League has been a part of summer in Southern Ontario for 99 years now and for its 100th season, the League is venturing into Eastern Ontario with the admission of the Ottawa Fatcats. Ottawa replaces the Oshawa Dodgers who suspended operations following the 2009 season.

The League has had its ups and downs over the years, but it continues to provide baseball fans with exciting action every summer.

The League began in 1919 with just four teams...Galt, Guelph, Stratford and Kitchener. Despite a rocky start the Inter-County managed to survive its first season.

The rest, as they say is history.

It's a long and rich history too. In the early years the League expanded with London, Brantford, Preston and St. Thomas joining at various times.

By the mid 1930s, the Inter-County had established a reputation as one of Ontario's best amateur leagues. In fact when Stratford won the Ontario Baseball Association title in 1934, it was the League's fifth OBA title in a row.

The League survived the Second World War in good shape, even though many players joined the armed forces. After the war, the League became professional in everything but name.

The Inter-County was considered by the professional ranks as an "outlaw" league at that time. The bidding war for players was fierce, and many ex-major league players came to Ontario looking for a few last baseball bucks.

So many came, in fact, that the League was considered on a par with many minor pro leagues. Great crowds came out to see the games, which were played under floodlights for the first time in the 1950s, and the senior league appointed its first commissioner, John Gillies, a London lawyer and former pitcher in the League.
