



This is the start of my 9th season as the Manager of the London Majors and marks some more positive change for both our team and the league. This year the IBL is back to our standard 36 games with the regular season finishing at the end of July. This gives the kids on US baseball scholarships a chance to play the full season in the IBL.

Looking at our team on the field this season, it is again made up of mainly London area players with some top Canadian and International talent mixed in.

Returning players to the Majors line-up include: outfielder Paul LaMantia, first baseman Cleveland Brownlee, catcher Derrick Strzalkowski, shortstop Paul Lytwynec, infielders Paul Young and Jon Celestino, and pitchers Dave Wydeven, Brett Sabourin, Cory Hammond, and Josh Palmer.

Some of our top recruits this season include: outfielder Chris Dennis from the Windsor-area who was formerly in the Milwaukee Brewers farm system. Chris was with me all the way back in 2007 and was actually the first player I helped get drafted. Also joining us is infielder Cody Mombourquette who played for the now defunct Ottawa Fat Cats. A familiar face to our fans also includes Phil Delisle from Quebec who played for me back in 2009.

Casey Pulham is returning for yet another season as my third base coach with a familiar face as the new addition in the first-base coach role in Max Escrogin. Max played on the team last year and is a welcome addition to our coaching staff with the departure of Jeremy Parking who retired due to family commitments.

We were proud of our second overall finish last season in the regular season and the third straight year we have finished second overall in the regular season. We lost to eventual finalists in Barrie in five games after sweeping Burlington in the first round. This is something we are looking to build on for this upcoming season.

Our players also had individual accomplishments which we look to build on including Ryan LaPensee winning the IBL batting title, our third batting champion since I started as the Manager. Also in 2013 we had IBL all-stars in Cory Hammond, LaPensee and Adwin Springer. While Adwin has retired due to work commitments, we hope LaPensee may return to the Majors pin-stripes in a part-time role.

The Majors will continue with our strong tradition of community partnerships off the field as well with partnerships with numerous charity and business groups such as the London Abused Women's Centre (LAWC), and Sifton Pack the Park just to name two.



London Majors playing for a good cause

They're playing for a good cause Friday night, but the London Majors also have good cause to play for themselves. They take on the Toronto Maple Leafs at Labatt Park on Purple In The Park night, in support of the London Abused Women's Centre, with the Majors wearing special purple jerseys and signing a custom-made purple bat, with all of the items being auctioned off. At the same time, the Majors (7-4) are hoping to end a two-game minislide that saw them lose a 15-11 slugfest in Kitchener Sunday night and drop a 7-4 decision Tuesday night in Guelph.

Toronto comes in with a 4-7 mark, but has owned the Majors of late. Since the start of the 2010 season, the Leafs are 10-3 against London, including a 9-4 season-opening win in the Smoke.

"We have a lot of new guys who may not know the history with Toronto, but for them and the guys who have been here a while, we want to get back on the winning track," Majors manager Roop Chanderdat said Thursday. "We want to prove to every team that we can compete with them and beat them and Toronto is no different."

With the Leafs' having a lot of left-handed hitters, the Majors will go with lefty Jordan Townshend (1-0).

Before the game, which is slated to start a little later than usual at 7:45 p.m., Chanderdat will be honoured for reaching the 150-win milestone as the Majors' field boss. That win came in the second game of a doubleheader sweep of Barrie May 27 and he now has a career mark of 151-108 since taking over at the start of the 2006 season.

"When you achieve something like this, it gives you a chance to reflect. And you certainly don't do this by yourself," he said. "I've had great assistant coaches (Casey Pulham, James Sinfield and Jeremy Parking) and some great players and great teams over the years."

Of course, also being the GM and co-owner along with Scott Dart does make for a higher degree of job security. Joking aside, Chanderdat, 44, said he'll know when it's time to hand the reins over.

"I do sit down with Scott and talk about things," he said. "And I'm hard on myself. I put in a lot of hours and I want to be successful and sometimes I'm even over the top with what I do as far as the details. But I still have that passion; I still love getting to the park early and putting the work in."

Unfortunately for Majors fans, they won't be seeing first baseman Cleveland Brownlee for a while as he has returned to Atlanta after the death of his grandmother. There will be a new face in the team, though, in the form of catcher-infielder Larry Balkwill of Chatham.

HONUS WAGNER. CONNIE MACK AND MOONEY GIBSON

Through the years Labatt Park has seen its share of celebrity players and hall of famers. The accompanying picture taken by a London Free Press photog appeared in John Castle's neat little book "Goldie's Curve Ball" . His well-researched work is a gem and was published to substantiate a claim that his grandfather Fred Goldsmith belongs in both the National and Canadian baseball halls of fame.

That Goldsmith. who led the London Tecumsehs to Canada's first professional baseball championship in 1877. has been denied his rightful place as a hall of famer is a travesty. But that's another story.

On August 12, 1943 baseball legends and National hall of famers Honus Wagner and Connie Mack were special guests at a London Old-Timers vs. Police benefit game played before some 4,000 spectators at Labatt Park. The contest raised \$1,000 which went to the Queen's Canadian Fund for Air Raid Victims in England.

In a bit of delicious nostalgia Castle eludes to the irrepressible Mack who was nattily attired in suit, white shirt and tie. That's which how he appeared in the dugout throughout his lengthly career as manager of the Philadelphia (now Oakland) Athletics. He never wore a uniform as did other managers.

Mack was also a player with the Philadelphia team when they lost to the Tecumsehs in 1877. The Tecumsehs behind Goldsmith's "twister" took on all comers that year compiling a record of 47 wins, 23 losses and 7 ties and along the way won both the Canadian and International Association titles. Goldie pitched all 77 games. Among the victims were the U.S. champion Chicago White Stockings and hall of famer Cap Anson whom London defeated 5-4 before an overflow crowd at Labatt Park for the mythical professional title.

Although it was Mack's first visit to our fair city in 1943 he said that London was in the baseball records. "I realize you have had baseball greats in London. There was Fred Goldsmith, the first man to pitch a curve ball. I remember batting against him." Mack, a catcher, didn't say how he fared against the London ace.

Mack died on Feb. 8, 1956 at age 93 leaving a legacy of five World Series championships, 3,731 wins, 3,948 losses, the most managerial wins, losses and games played.

The class of shortstops and at bat, Wagner won eight major league batting titles before compiling a 33-51 record as a Pittsburgh coach. He died on Dec. 6, 1955 at age 81.

Joining the festivities was catcher George (Mooney) Gibson who won a World Series in 1909 when the Pirates defeated the Detroit Tigers in seven games. Mooney even threw out the irascible Ty Cobb on an attempted steal of second base, Gibson was proud of his hometown and returned here to live out his days after a career which included a stint as manager of the Pirates.

Mooney died in 1967 at age 86 and is buried in a Mount Brydges cemetery. He is a member of both the Canadian baseball and the London Sports halls of fame.

Labatt Park: The World's Oldest Baseball Grounds

While many Londoners are aware the City of Londonowned Labatt Park the world's oldest baseball grounds, Ontario Heritage Act, few people know how it came about. Here's the story. It has a few twists and turns.

Back in the early 1990s, when the Eastern League AA London Tigers were still in town (1989-1993), former London Mayor Tom Gosnell made the suggestion to the local heritage advisory committee that Labatt

Park qualified as a heritage property and to consider pursuing it. Unfortunately, the idea died on the vine for two reasons:

1. At the time in London, appreciation for "sports and cultural heritage" hadn't reached full bloom. London still had the narrow mindset that only the bricks and mortar of "built heritage" (often grandiose Victorian buildings) were worthy of heritage protection. 2. The London Tigers had no idea what heritage designation would entail, so it scared them ~ needlessly, I might add.

After the Tigers left London for New Jersey in 1993, Councillor Gary Williams stood up during a city council meeting and suggested selling Labatt Park for a condo development ~ even though the park's in the floodplain and exempt from any new development except in rare, specific circumstances.

That's when the volunteer group the Friends of Labatt Park formed and sprang into action, successfully lobbying city council to designate the ballpark under the Ontario Heritage Act in 1994, with a well-attended plaque unveiling at the park on Canada Day prior to a Majors' game against the IBL's Toronto Maple Leafs.

During the 1994 Canada Day event, then-Majors' owner-manager-player Arden Eddie asked if the designation protected the old team clubhouse, built in 1937. Unfortunately, it didn't because it wasn't specifically included in the by-law's "reasons for designation" ~ a significant oversight on our part.

ROY MCKAY: So the "Friends" went to work again to officially amend the designating by-law to include the "Roy McKay Clubhouse," which occurred two years later in 1996.

On August 1, 1996, a commemorative boulder and large plaque were installed in front of the tongue-and-groove clubhouse honouring #16, Roy McKay (Aug. 1, 1933~Dec. 25, 1995), who began his career with the Majors as a mascot-batboy in the mid 1940s, before graduating to become an all-star pitcher and manager. Over the years, McKay mentored hundreds of ball players.

Sadly, Roy McKay injured his neck when he fell on the front porch of his Waterloo Street home before passing away at age 65 on Christmas Day of 1995.

Today at Labatt Park, there's a total of nine heritage-related plaques and seven commemorative trees, courtesy of various individuals and community groups ~ three red oaks, two crimson-king maples (including one in memory of Roy McKay), a sugar maple and a white ash.

Labatt Park and the London Majors are about tradition, enjoyable times and quality baseball at affordable prices. The list of outstanding players who've taken to the field at the park since 1877 reads like a who's-who of Major League Baseball. If there's a better way to enjoy a spring-summer afternoon or evening, I haven't found it.





The Intercounty Baseball League has been a part of summer in Southern Ontario for 92 years now and for its 93rd season, the League is venturing into Eastern Ontario with the admission of the Ottawa Fatcats. Ottawa replaces the Oshawa Dodgers who suspended operations following the 2009 season. The League has had its ups and downs over the years, but it continues to provide baseball fans with exciting action every summer.

The League began in 1919 with just four teams...Galt, Guelph, Stratford and Kitchener. Despite a rocky start the Inter-County managed to survive its first season.

The rest, as they say is history.

It's a long and rich history too. In the early years the League expanded with London, Brantford, Preston and St. Thomas joining at various times.

By the mid 1930s, the Inter-County had established a reputation as one of Ontario's best amateur leagues. In fact when Stratford won the Ontario Baseball Association title in 1934, it was the League's fifth OBA title in a row.

The League survived the Second World War in good shape, even though many players joined the armed forces. After the war, the League became professional in everything but name.

The Inter-County was considered by the professional ranks as an "outlaw" league at that time. The bidding war for players was fierce, and many ex-major league players came to Ontario looking for a few last baseball bucks.

So many came, in fact, that the League was considered on a par with many minor pro leagues. Great crowds came out to see the games, which were played under floodlights for the first time in the 1950s, and the senior league appointed its first commissioner, John Gillies, a London lawyer and former pitcher in the League.




