



Gabby let his bat do all the talking

You can add Stan (Gabbu) Anderson to the list of former Majors who have gained hall of fame status. The soft-spoken Gabbu, who earned his nickname not for being outspoken but because he said little as a teen-age prospect, is among the London Sports Hall of fame inductees for 2008.

It's a well-deserved honour, too. He patrolled right field for 12 years with Majors and Pontiacs teams, winning the Intercounty batting title in 1960 with a nifty .391 average and earning first-team all-star status six times. In 1959 he was the Intercounty most valuable player.

Want more? Well, in 1957, the first year he joined the Majors under Frank Colman -- they were in the Great Lakes League -- Gabby took the batting title with a .403 average and was MVP in that loop.

Like Colman, the affable ex-Yankee, Gabby grew up in the East End and learned his baseball on the playgrounds. The fact that he was a teen practice player with the Majors when they won the National

Baseball Congress North American championship in 1948 helped spur him to a minor pro stint with Peoria, IL and Olean, M.Y. At Peoria he earned rookie of the year honours with a 350 batting average.

Gabby was born in Detroit on Nov. 29, 1929, the oldest of six boys. The Anderson family moved to London when he was only a few months old.

He joins George (Mooney) Gibson, Colman, Tom (Tim) Burgess, and Arden Eddie as members of the London Hall. The first three are also enshrined in the Canadian Baseball Hall of fame in St. Marys.

The '48 Majors were put into the London Hall during the first wave of inductees in 2002. Only three guys from that team -- Jack fairs, Gil Robertson and Joe Bechard are living.

Look for all of these Hall of Tamers plus players and umpires from yesteryear to be part of "Oldtimers Day at the Ball Park" on Sunday, July 6 when they will be honoured between games of the Majors-Toronto doubleheader. It starts at 1 p.m.

TED ALEXANDER

London Majors Pitcher Ted Alexander aided baseball legend Jackie Robinson By Stephen Harding

Ted Alexander, formerly of the U.S. Negro Leagues, pitched for the London Majors of the Intercounty Baseball League in 1950 & 1951. Dan "Uncle Buck" Mendham recalls: "Ted came to London from Detroit driving a shiny new 1950 ford Mercury. He was a happy-go-lucky guy, a bit of a showman, yakking all the time. Ted always had a can of wax in his hand, polishing that car. During the baseball season he lived with a black family in a house on Clarence St. south of Horton St. He was real heavy and the Majors didn't have a uniform big enough to fit him. He started the season in his Homestead Grays outfit. Ted got by pretty good in what was a very tough league. It was big business then, lots of imports were being signed. I think he was here for part of the "51 season and played in Brandon, Manitoba after that."

Alexander had pitched for the Homestead Grays and the Kansas City Monarchs of the Negro National League. During the winter he barnstormed in Venezuela, Puerto Rico and Hawaii. During WW2 he played for the US Army major leaguers. In the fall of 1944, Alexander was at Camp Breckinridge, Ky., when Jackie Robinson happened to see him pitching. Robinson was awaiting his discharge from the US Army, and looking for a career to follow. Alexander encouraged Robinson to contact the Kansas City Monarchs and play professional baseball in the Negro Leagues. Robinson joined the Monarchs at their training camp in Texas the following spring.

While playing with the Monarchs Robinson was scouted by the Brooklyn Dodgers. Branch Rickey, the Dodgers manager, signed Robinson and sent him to the Montreal Royals, the Dodgers International League affiliate in 1946. Robinson helped the Royals win the International League championship that season. In 1947 Robinson started at second base for the Brooklyn Dodgers and the integration of Major League Baseball began.

Soon the Negro Leagues lost their star players and young prospects to the Major Leagues and their fan base melted away. As the teams folded, many players extended their baseball careers by playing in Canada. Wilmer Fields, Jimmy Wilkes, Luther Clifford, Max Manning, Lester Lockett, Bob Thurman and Doc Glenn made appearances at Labatt Park playing in the Intercounty Baseball League in the 1950s'.



Majors makeover means new faces, new hopes By SEAN MEYER The Londoner

Just call it Extreme Makeover: The London Majors Edition. Following a 2007 Intercounty Baseball League (IBL) season that didn't exactly go according to plan. Roop Chanderdat decided his team needed an almost complete makeover. The end result is a 2008 edition of the Majors which will see only a half-dozen or so players returning from a roster that finished seventh in the IBL regular season and was swept out of the playoffs in the first round by the Brantford Red Sox.

"I want to win so I knew this team had to be revamped. There were some guys we targeted to come back, but I knew we had to improve this team," says Roop who besides being London's co-owner is also the team's general manager and field manager as well. "There were guys I knew I wanted back. I had a third baseman and a right fielder; that meant I had seven other positions to go. I knew it was going to be my busiest off-season ever, but I was also excited by the challenge."

The core of players Roop wanted back included Kule Piwowarczyk (.373, six stolen bases, 22 RBIs), Kevin Virtue (.288, 43 total bases, 20 RBIs), Mike Mitro (10 games, two wins, 20 strikeouts), Ted Kalnins (nine games, one save, 10 strikeouts) and Josh Palmer (5-6, five wins, 40 strikeouts). "Kyle was a second-team all-star. You know what you get from him. Kyle was worried when we moved him from second to third base, but by the end of the season he was right up there with the very best in the league," Roop says. Josh led the way for us with five wins. He didn't get going early because of the pressure of possibly being drafted, and when he didn't, that affected him too. But down the stretch he was great with four wins. He was our most valuable pitcher. Mike is a guy who is dedicated to London and Ted is a London guy, he knows his role and is always right there, giving his all."

After a busy winter of player signings, Roop says he is happy with the team he has assembled. That team will begin the 2008 IBL this Saturday. May 10, in Guelph. London plays its first three games this season on the road before opening up the home schedule, Sunday. May 18, against the Stratford Nationals.

Among those players Roop is most excited about adding are Toshi Sasa, an infielder/outfielder who played for the Fullerton Flyers of the Golden Baseball League in 2006, batting .271, Mike Galloway, a former member of the Toronto Blue Jays and Kansas City Royals organizations who won a homerun title in the independent Frontier League, and Canadian national junior team members Dave Narodowski and Mehdi Djebbar.

Roop is particularly happy to have signed former Stratford Nationals second-team all-star Will Richards who hit .312 with six home runs and 24 RBIs last season.

"We've never had a number one catcher who stayed with us (former catcher Chris Dennis left the Majors after signing with the Milwaukee Brewers who selected him during last summers Major League Baseball amateur draft) and now we've added Will Richards," Roop says. "I have coached Will at the all-star game two years in a row now and he definitely fills that number one role."

Other additions include Christian Ruiz, who was listed among the top 100 players in Puerto Rico, and Mitch Delaney, who Roop says is expected to be selected within the first eight rounds of this year's amateur draft.

While the team has seven players returning from last season, there is one other significant returnee who actually missed all of last season. Scott Dart, the Majors' co-owner and team president, was dealing with pancreatitis last year, but is back in good health and looking forward to not only helping run the business-side of the Majors, but watching a lot of action on the diamond as well.

"I am looking forward to seeing a lot of baseball his year. It was very frustrating last year, not being able to be here. At least I could watch the games on Rogers," Scott says. "I kept in touch a little, but it was hard to watch the games knowing I couldn't be there, couldn't be a real part of the team."

This season, however, Scott says he is looking forward to coming out to Labatt Park and seeing an exciting team on the field.

happen," Scott says. "I think you have your elite teams, Brantford, Toronto, Barrie, and then a group right after that. We are right there. We feel we could be there in that top four. If you look at the pieces Roop has added, we could be a real good team." Scott also says the off-field business of the Majors is also looking positive as well.


"We've had good contacts with the community, we are looking to get more groups involved. If things pan out, I think you will see that happen and more fans coming out," Scott says. "If everything goes according to plan I think we'll average around 500 fans for our regular season games. Special events like Canada Day, Father's Day, opening day, we expect they will be much bigger." While Roop shies away from predicting wins and losses, he does say with a smile he is hoping to maintain an interesting recent trend. The past four years has seen the Majors alternate between reaching the league finals and losing in the first round of the playoffs and London is coming off a first round sweep last

"I don't know about wins and losses. I think we are going to be a good team though," Roop says." I think we will be a competitive team on the field. We'll just have to see what happens."
