#### **BRIAN MURPHY**


For baseball "the stopper" is a most Important asset






#### DAVE HALL

A real scrapper, Dave stands far taller than his short statue, and is an important cog as the AVCO's go looking for a fourth straight Intercounty pennant.






#### ARDEN EDDIE
