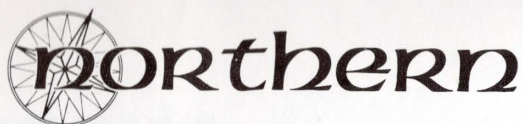

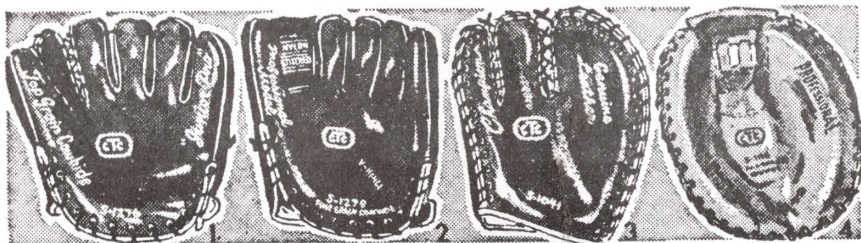
Brian's bat, was also important for although having only 7 hits, he drove in 8 runs.

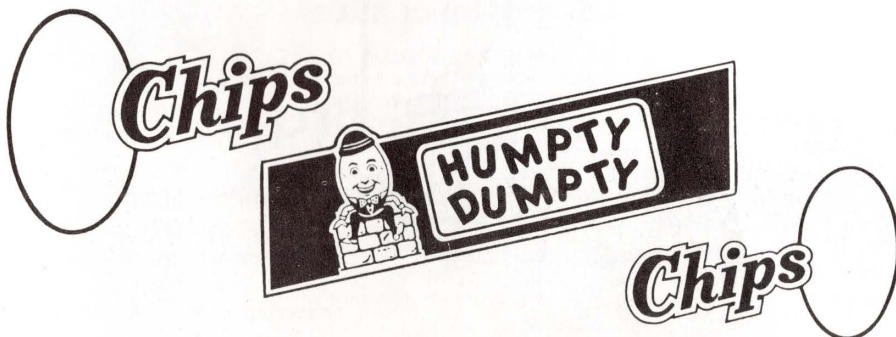

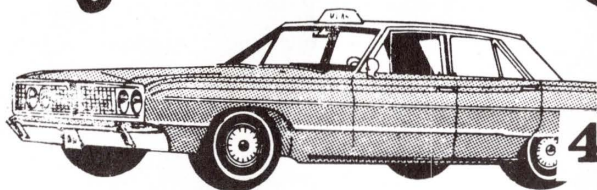
## ARDEN EDDIE
