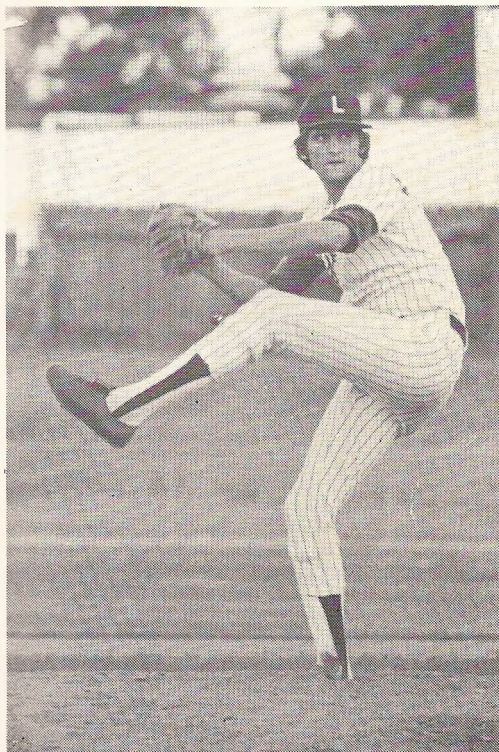

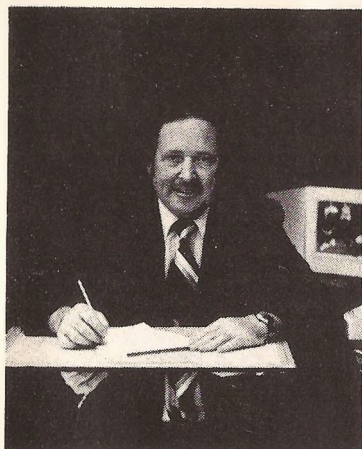

Roy McKay: Manager

1981 was not a year Major's Manager Roy McKay would like to brag about. It was a year of ups and downs to say the least. Frustrating for both players and fans, even tougher for the person signing his name to the bottom of the line-up card.

You probably won't get any predictions out of Roy on the 1982 Majors, but this year's team looks strangely familiar to those of the early 70's: Excellent pitching, rich in experience, and plenty of hitting power.



A HISTORY OF THE INTER-COUNTY

The Inter-county Baseball Association's name is self-explanatory. It is derived from the fact that the originating teams were from various cities and towns in different counties. The first meeting of the league was held in Galt, Ontario, in 1918 and the members debated whether to call the league the Inter-city or Inter-county.

The Inter-county name was voted in and the league began operations in 1919 and has operated continuously ever since.

This year, being 1982 is the 113 anniversary of baseball in North America and particularly, in the United States. Many Canadians have a habit of selling themselves short, and one must realize that this year, 1982, is also the 63rd anniversary of the Inter-county Baseball Association. There are not many leagues in the U.S.A. that can make that statement. It shows in our own small way we must have something on the ball to last so long. The original members of the league consisted of Galt, Kitchener, Guelph and London. It was a horse and buggy league in those days playing a small schedule on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons. The tough travel games were to London or vice-versa, travel being done for those games by train. The Saturday games were a week-end affair and if you got out of the saloon early enough on Saturday night to catch the train, you made work for Monday morning. You see, in those days no trains ran out of London on Sunday. The league flourished with its Inter-county populous rivalry and down through the years more centres joined the league. Waterloo, Stratford and others added their weight and the league expanded to various age groups, so that it became an Association of value. Many good ball players were developed and played in the Association all the way from Bantam to Senior. The Inter-county became the most feared league

in the province when it came play-off time with other leagues or associations. Any time you were pitted against an Inter-county team in any age group, you had a tiger by the tail.

When one mentions the play-off-time this means the Ontario Baseball Association or as a number of people say, the O.B.A. Now, the O.B.A. was formed in 1917 by W. J. Smith of Toronto, and most baseball leagues or associations in the province are members for the express purpose of proceeding further to find out who is the over-all Inter-league Champions or O.B.A. Champions. Mr. Smith, the founder, is still alive and kicking in Hogtown at this writing and may he last another 70 years.

Many players of note have played in the Inter-county; they are too numerous to mention, but, we must talk about some. The writer's memory goes back a few years and names like: Craig, Biddle, Miskimmons, White, Coleman, Burgess, Evon, Judd, come to mind. They were good, sound players—I know they got me out enough. The Inter-county has had some lean years and in some cases each section suffering dropouts. The senior league at one time was reduced to four teams, but, never folded and kept coming back. Today, 1983 we have ten teams and the future looks bright.

We, the members of the Inter-county, past and present, wish to take this opportunity to thank all baseball fans everywhere for the support you have given us over the years, in order for us to survive. We need your support and criticism in order to continue and improve. Without it, we can't play and if we can't play, we just can't get better.

We thank you one and all for your 63 years of support and may it continue at least another sixty-three.

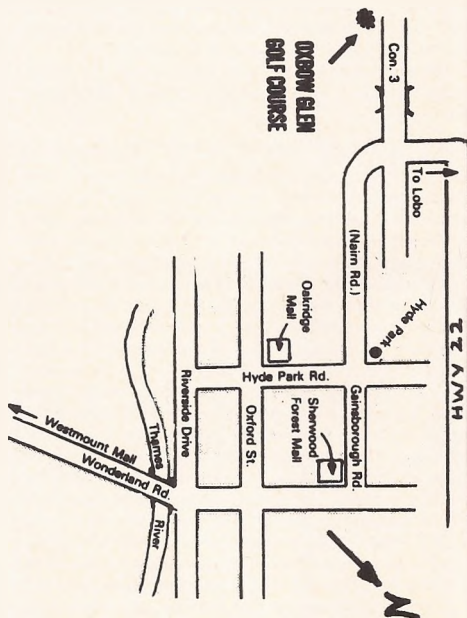

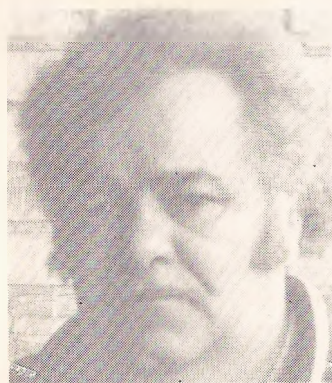

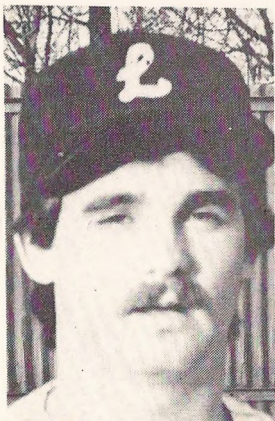

JIM DALTON Pitcher T-R

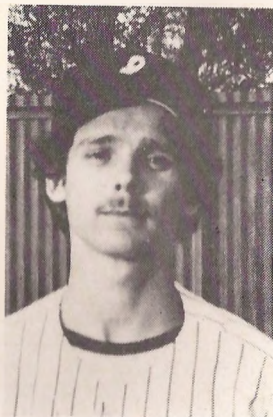

JAY SUITS B-R T-R

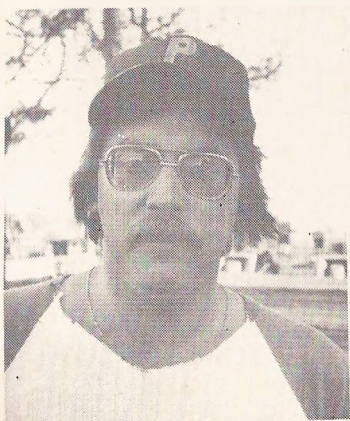
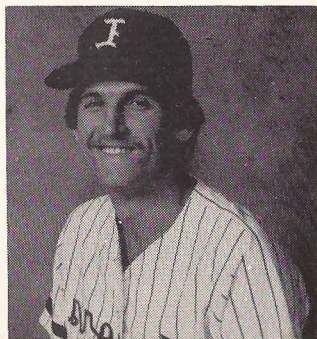

TOM MATTINGLEY "Matt"

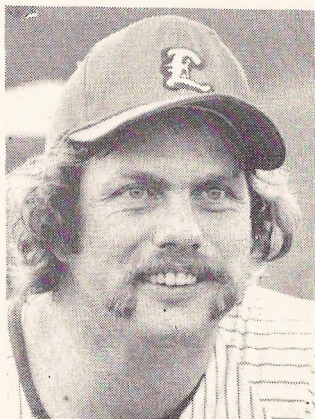

The Great did something about it by acquiring a franchise in the Halton County Senior League, which he promptly gave and allowed the Leaside Baseball Association the use of same. Alex could see that there were more players coming up than one senior team could absorb so he set out and acquired a franchise for Toronto in the Intercounty Senior and Junior Leagues. While Alex was engaged in procuring these franchises he also designed and sold the idea of an all Ontario Baseball Tournament to the Labatt Brewers of London, Ontario.

Alex has had an uphill battle in order to do these things, and on the way he has experienced many difficulties. Alex says the biggest hurdles have been apathetic and pessimistic outlook by many so called baseball people. The Great says, if you see something that you think isn't right don't sit back and knock it. Join the group and lend your talents, if any, to improve it.

6. Ernie Shore is the only relief pitcher in history to throw a perfect game. Shore relieved Babe Ruth June 23rd, 1917 after Ruth had walked the leadoff batter. That man was caught stealing second, and Shore then retired the next 26 men in order . . .
7. Don Drysdale gave up 17 Hank Aaron homeruns, more than any other pitcher. Claude Osteen and Bob Friend tied for second with 13 each . . .
8. The Cincinnati Reds and Pittsburgh Pirates played baseball's first night game, May 24th, 1935 at Crosley Field in Cincinnati . . .
9. U.S. President Ronald Reagan portrayed pitcher Grover Cleveland Alexander in the 1950 movie "The Winning Team" . . .
10. Former New York Met and Montreal Expo Ron Hunt was hit by a record 243 pitches during his 11-year career . . .
11. In 1978, Abraham Lincoln Junior High School in Lindsay, California was renamed the Steve Garvey Junior High School . . .
12. Lou Gehrig's sister, Adeline, was the U.S. women's fencing champion from 1920 through 1923 . . .
13. Sandy Koufax went to the University of Cincinnati on a basketball scholarship . . .
14. Babe Ruth had 123 career stolen bases . . .
15. When Bobby Thomson hit his 'shot heard round the world', Willie Mays was in the on-deck circle . . .
16. Ernie Banks and former NFL star O.J. Simpson are second cousins . . .
17. The oldest park in the Major Leagues is Comiskey Park in Chicago, built in 1910
18. Baseball teams in Philadelphia have ended in last place a record 42 times . . .
19. One of the most-feared teams in baseball, the 1927 Yankees, had only one 20-game winner. Waite Hoyt had a record of 22-7 . . .
20. Majors' manager Roy McKay had his best pitching season in 1958 when he had a 10-6 record, and ERA of 2.79, and led the league with 13 complete games . . .

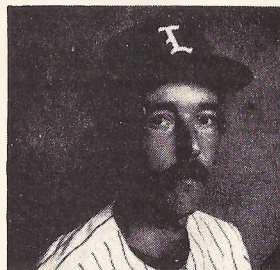

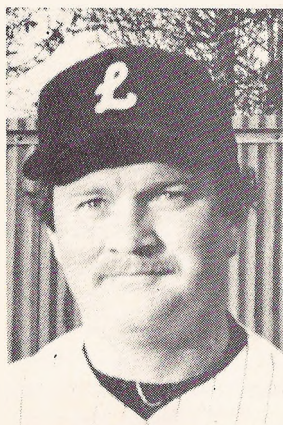


WAYNE FENLON B-L T-R

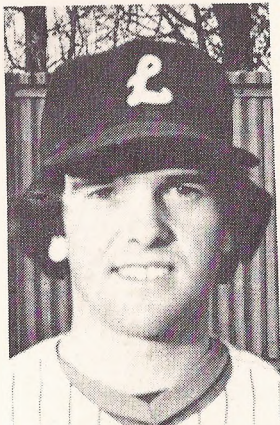
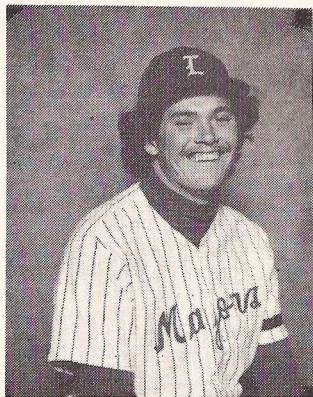


ARDEN EDDIE B-L T-R

RON HART

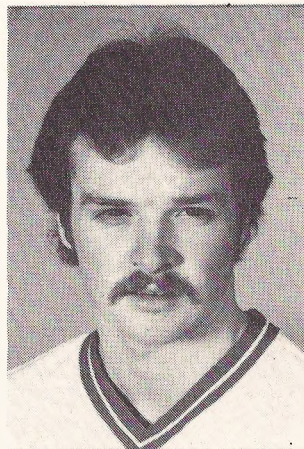
