About M2

Major Arena Soccer League 2 was established for the 2017-18 season, and works in close contact with its parent league – the Major Arena Soccer League – which features some of the most iconic professional indoor soccer franchises including the San Diego Sockers, Baltimore Blast and Milwaukee Wave, whose lineage all go back to the 1970s and 1980s.

M2 serves as a second-level of the MASL's three-level pyramid approach to develop professional indoor soccer throughout the United States and Mexico. The league is a mix of development teams fielded by MASL squads such as the San Diego Sockers, Ontario Fury and Chihuahua Savage, and franchises in mid-level markets with in almost all instances arena capacities from approximately 2,000 to 5,000 seats.

Many young M2 stars have moved on to the sport's top level in recent years, including Wichita's Eduardo "Benji" Monreal and Omaha's Ali Sodal (both with the Kansas City Comets) and Muskegon's Breno Oliveira (Florida Tropics). Most recently, a number of M2 players attend the MASL's first ever nationwide player combine in Mesquite Texas, where many were chosen by one the MASL teams during a three-round player draft.

Working in close conjunction with the MASL leadership triumvirate of Commissioner Keith Tozer, Chairman Shep Messing and President of Communications/Media J.P. Dellacamera, M2 has its own leadership team of Commissioner Chris Economides and Deputy Commissioner Andrew Ross based in Tampa, Florida.

Major Arena Soccer League 2 will kick off its sixth season of pro indoor soccer the weekend of Dec. 3-5. The San Diego Sockers 2, who posted an impressive 11-1 regular season record are the defending league champions,. The Sockers won their title during last season's Championship Weekend staged in Muskegon, Michigan, matching the MASL title won by their parent club.

"Season five had some of our most exciting matches ever – our semifinal games were both one-goal affairs with one going into overtime as an example – so we can't wait for season six to officially begin," Economides said. "As our now direct affiliation with the MASL continues to grow and strengthen, we will have exciting announcements in the coming weeks about new teams and relationships that will grow the sport as we have intended all along."



Major Arena Soccer League 2 will now have its owner's meeting at the same time and place each fall as the MASL, Economides noted, and all M2 teams were invited to have general managers and coaches at the MASL Combine scheduled in late October in Mesquite where over 100 potential players put their talents on display.

"It's exciting the MASL is taking a more active role and interest in being even greater partners. Allowing our M2 owners, coaches and general managers to be part of their events opens opportunities for more dialogue and cooperation for growing the sport together," Economides added. "At the top level, the sport's leaders recognize the quality of play and positive commitment to the sport that each M2 franchise exudes."

Currently, three MASL teams field M2 clubs as well, although that number is expected to grow as soon as next season. Expansion teams and their for this year include Cedar Rapids, Dodge City, Kansas, Tijuana, Mexico and the Rochester, N.Y. Lancers who have played at both the MASL and M2 level prior to the COVID pandemic.



M2's official opening weekend is Dec. 3 in a battle for early season bragging rights when the Iowa Demon Hawks (based in Des Moines) meet the Cedar Rapids based Iowa Raptors. A total of 90 regular season games are on the schedule – with every single one of them on a Friday, Saturday or Sunday – with the final games leading into the post season scheduled March 26.

“With our move to higher standards, with more and more of our teams moving to larger arena settings, its a great accomplishment to still be able to offer all weekend games to our fans, “ Economides noted. “ “It’s a great schedule for fans, and the competition should be intense in each division,” Economides said. “Every team plays games only in their division this season, so every game will be extremely meaningful since winning your division is the one sure ticket to the playoffs.”

>> **MOST RECENT:** The indoor Lancers last took to the field in

2019-20 as a member of the Major Arena Soccer League, which had to cut it season short and cancel the post-season because of the Covid pandemic.

>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** The Lancers brand goes all the way back to 1967 when they debuted in the American Soccer League before moving to the North American Soccer League between 1970 and 1970. In 1995, "SoccerSam" Fantuzzo purchased the rights to the Lancers brand, In January, 1975, the Lancers hosted the New York Cosmos, Boston Minutemen and Hartford in an NASL regional indoor tournament, with more than 5,200 fans attending the two days of games. They also participated in four games



of the 1976 NASL indoor tournament, winning three and advancing to the finals where they lost to the host Tampa Bay Rowdies. The Lancers have the distinction of playing before the largest crowd ever for a Rochester sporting event when 20,500 fans showed up in 1977 for a match against the New York Cosmos. Later that same season, the played before the largest crowd ever to watch a Rochester based team play when 74,000 Cosmos fans packed Giants Stadium for a Lancers visit. The Lancers returned to pro indoor soccer in 2011 finishing second in the Major Indoor Soccer League's eastern division and played through the end of the 2014-15 season, with a combined four-year record of 37-53. The returned in 2018-19 to Major Arena Soccer League 2, going 8-4 and finishing third overall in the league. The moved up to the parent Major Arena Soccer League in 2019-20 when the season was cut short and playoffs canceled because of the Covid pandemic. Because the team's arena was used a Covid vaccination site and other pandemic related matters, the team has not played indoor since.

>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** The Demon Hawks owner is Darwin Salas – owner of several Des Moines radio stations including La Q Buena 106.9, the No. 1 rated Latino station in Iowa, and who has spent over two decades in the entertainment and promotions business. The team is the former Des Moines United FC who played in Major Arena Soccer League 3 last season. They will share an arena with the Iowa Raptors this year, with a planned move to a Des Moines arena for the 2023-24 season. The Demon Hawks have several players expected to suit up who have Major Arena Soccer League experience, including Rapha Nascimento, who played for both the Florida Tropics and St. Louis Ambush, Nascimento was also a member of Brazil's 2021 National Arena Soccer team. Also inked are MASL standouts Ricardo Diegues and goalkeeper Rainer Hauss, who will be joined by Charles Bales, who played previously with the Cedar Rapids Rampage who played three seasons in the MASL. In fact, some 10 different nationalities are represented on the roster, which also includes Juan Nunez, a professional Liga MX player champion with Los Cholos de Tijuana Mexico. Juan Fernandes Jr., a former professional player in Brazil who has spent 25 years at the head man for several universities and clubs, will serve as coach. The team's history dates back to 2017 when it was a futsal side based in Des Moines. In 2018, the United were the U.S. Futsal Midwest Regional Champions and went to become a World Futsal Finalist at ESPN World of sports complex in Orlando, Florida. They were members of the Major Futsal League during the 2018-19 year, and in 2021 were the United Premier Soccer League Midwest champions, finishing in the top 8 in the U.S. They played one season at M3 before moving to M2 this year.

Raptors first season of play in Major Arena Soccer League 2, the pro indoor game is no stranger in Cedar Rapids. The Rampage played in the Major Arena Soccer League for three seasons from 2015-2018, compiling an overall record of 28-34 while playing at U.S. Cellular Arena, which is now the Alliant Energy Power House. The Raptors organization first debuted in 2019, with a men's team in the United Premier Soccer League. Among the players to watch for the Raptors this season are Jonah Dancer who has been with the Raptors organization since 2019, Ruben Ortiz and Ronaldo Rojas. Forward Ricardo Orozco brings indoor experience playing M2 last season for Chicago, getting 10 goals and 10 assists. Former Kansas City Comet and Rampage player Patrick Lewis is also signed.

>> **MOST RECENT:** The Bombers finished 2021-22 with three-game regular season win streak, and just missed qualifying for the M2 post-season, keeping their hopes alive right to the final game of the season. Wichita, Omaha and Amarillo all tied for the midwest regular season title with 7-5 records, but the Wings and Royals advance to the playoffs on a tiebreaker.



>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** This will be the fourth year of pro indoor soccer in Amarillo as the Bombers have been near the top of the M2 standings in each of their , and have finished with a better than .500 record in their previous three campaigns. The played in the M2 championship weekend in Wichita in the summer of 2021, falling to the Cleveland Crunch who eventually won the M2 title, 12-6 in the semi-finals, Vitor Patriani has proven to be an M2 star for Amarillo, having netted 21 goals last year, fifth overall in the league. Miguel Reyes was tied for the league lead in powerplay goals last season, and amazingly, the Bombers had four short-handed goals, two each from David Trevizo and Alan Valenzuela. The only other player to score two shorties last season was San Diego's Rene Flores. In three years with the Bombers Patriani has appeared in 30 regular season games and has 62 goals. He lead all M2 scorers in the 2020-21 season with 21 goals as well. A native of Brazil, he played his college soccer at nearby West Texas A&M University, where Bombers Coach Chad Webb is the women's soccer head coach ... Bombers found the Civic Center to their liking last year, winning five of their six home games.

The Bandits are the first of three new teams that an investment group is expected to launch in the Midwest with a focus on expanding pro indoor soccer's footprint in the Heartland region. The Bandits will play in Dodge City's, municipally-owned 3,000 seat, United Wireless Arena which is part of the Boot Hill Casino and Resort Conference Center which opened in 2011. The arena is already home to the Champions Indoor Football league's Southwest Kansas Storm, which will be part of the Dodge City partnership consortium. Blake Shumaker, managing partner of the Major Arena Soccer League 2's Wichita Wings has been central in helping to organize the new investment group, indicated that plans to add two additional teams to their portfolio for the 2023-24 season have already begun.

>> **MOST RECENT:** The New Mexico Runners bounced back successfully in their 3rd season (2021-22) after being shut down for almost 22 months due to the Covid pandemic prior. The Runners have retained USL Hall of Fame inductee Steve Famiglietta as Head Coach for their 4th season with his son Nick Famiglietta in the Assistant Coach position.

>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** The New Mexico Runners are New Mexico's first Major Arena Soccer League team and the 2022-23 season will be the fourth full season of pro indoor soccer in Rio Rancho, a northern suburb of Albuquerque. The Runners were founded by Andres Trujillo in 2018 and are 100 percent New Mexican Family owned and operated. Andres is a local sports media icon born and raised in New Mexico with a history of investing in and starting local sports teams, a former ESPN Radio show host, as well as the Executive Director of New Mexico's largest sports festival called the New Mexico Games. The 2021-22 team leading scorer and league 3rd team All-Star Selection Mehrshad Amadi, is one of many Runners who have already re-signed to return to the Runners in 2022-23. Ahmadi who graduated from Sandia High School in Albuquerque, led the Runners last year, dressing in just seven games, but banging in 18 goals to go along with three assists. He ended his regular season in a win over the Turlock Cal Express with a five-goal performance. The offense should be in good shape again this season with the team's other three double-digit goals scorers all



returning, including team captain Froilan Ramirez (14 goals), Sergio Fuentes (12) and Skyler Rose (12) all who are all home grown New Mexico talent.

>> **MOST RECENT:** The Wings posted a 7-5 record last season, and advanced to the M2 playoffs where they were upset at home in the opening round of the post-season by the Omaha Kings, 8-7 in overtime.

>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** The Wings are one of pro indoor soccer's most storied franchises, with a history dating back to 1980 when they joined the original Major Indoor Soccer League, drawing standing room only crowds of over 9,000 "Orange Army" fans at the old Kansas Coliseum. The latest edition of the Wings joined the ranks



of Major Arena Soccer League 2 in 2019, and have been among the most successful franchise on and off the field since. No player embodies the spirit and history of the Wings more than the popular Kevin Ten Eyck, who has played 38 games for the M2 Wings over the past three seasons, posting 31 goals and getting 34 assists. Ten Eyck played for the Wings in 2011-13, the Wichita B-52's indoor team in 2013-15 before joining the Kansas City Comets of the MASL in 2016. In 96 games, he scored 42 goals and added 19 assists. He was the Wings leading regular season scorer last year with 13 goals and 13 assists. Bransyn Felty led Wichita in goals with 16, while Taylor Henry had nine goals and 11 assists. All three are expected to return in 2022-23.

Chihuahua played in the 2019-20 season, and in 12 games, posted a perfect 12-0 mark. However, the post-season was not held because of the Covid pandemic. The Savage had a remarkable goals differential of plus 84, In all, the Savage scored 134 goals and gave up just 50. Ten of the team's 12 games were played on the road. They will play their home games this season at the Corner Sport Arena, home of their Major Arena Soccer League parent team. The M1 side got off to a slow start last season, but was one of the hottest teams in the league at end of the regular season, winning their quarterfinals playoff matchup against the Baltimore Blast before falling in the semi-finals.

by winning their second M2 championship in the past six years, posting an 11-1 regular season record, and beating the undefeated Cleveland Crunch 7-4 in the league’s championship game in the spring.

>> **FRANCHISE NOTES/ HISTORY:** Their isn’t a more respected name in pro indoor soccer than the Sockers, who became the first team to ever claim championships in both the Major Arena Soccer League and M2 in the same season. In all, dating back to their indoor inception in the 1970s, the Sockers have won 16 indoor soccer championship titles, in addition to their now two M2 crowns. Current coach Rene Ortiz won Coach of the Year honors in 2019 when the Sockers 2 won their first title. They just missed out on a third M2 title when they lost in the 2018 championship game to Chicago. The Sockers were defensive stalwarts last year, allowing just 50 goals in the entire 12-game regular season. In the playoffs, they needed overtime wins against both the RGV Barracudas and Omaha Kings to earn a spot in the championship game. Ismael Rojo got the golden goal against Omaha, while Uziel Gonzalez got the game winner in extra time against RGV. Sockers are one of four teams remaining in the league that helped start M2 in the 2017-18 season. Sockers 2 have also preached strong defense. When winning the 2018-19 title, they allowed just 32 goals in the 12-game regular season. The Sockers 2 did not field a team for two years after their title, returning to M2 for the 2021-22 season.

He has over 30 years of experience in professional soccer, starting with the Rochester Rhinos of the USL where he led them to league and U.S. Open Cup championships. The Rhinos are the only non-MLS team to win the U.S. Open Cup since Major League Soccer (MLS) was established. After Rochester, Economides founded the Carolina Railhawks (now North Carolina FC) before moving to the USL front office to help establish and grow the league as a Senior Director and Commissioner of the MISL when it was managed by the USL. In addition to his experience in the outdoor game and league office, Chris has also managed arena teams



with the Kansas City Attack and most recently the Major Arena Soccer League Florida Tropics, both of which won championships under his leadership.

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER ANDREW ROSS

Andrew Ross brings a wealth of experience for over the past decade at all levels of the professional soccer landscape. Ross started his career working under now MASL Vice President Jon Ramin and Utica City FC General Manager Tommy Tanner at the Syracuse Silver Knights. Following the Silver Knights, he moved to Florida to work at the USL under Economides during the first season the USL was affiliated with MLS. After the USL, Ross moved to Orlando City SC for their first 2 seasons in MLS before establishing the Florida Tropics. Ross served as the General Manager for the past five years before moving into his current role with the league office. Ross also holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Sport Management from Syracuse University, one of the top sports programs in the country, has played soccer his whole life and is a certified coach at the competitive youth level throughout the Tampa Bay Area.



DIRECTOR OF OFFICIALS GRAEME FLORANCE

Graeme Florance has been the director of officials for M2 for the last four years. Over the past 28 years he has been a professional Indoor Referee in the NPSL/PASL/MISL and the MASL. Graeme has been a registered referee with the US Soccer Federation for 30 years, and is currently a regional emeritus Grade Referee. Graeme is also a US Soccer Assignor and Instructor, and a WMF (World Mini Football) International Grade Referee. He has officiated at World Cup Final Tournaments in the USA and Australia, and qualifying events in South America. Other soccer referee achievements include being a former NISOA National Referee.



DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC RELATIONS BRIAN ACKLEY

Ackley serves as the Director of Public Relations and Broadcasting for M2. Ackley – who spent 35 years in the newspaper industry, covering everything from the Winter Olympics, to Super Bowls to Mike Tyson just finished his sixth season as the MASL Florida Tropics Director of Public Relations and Broadcasting, serving as the "Voice of the Tropics" on their home game broadcasts. He brings a long history of covering and broadcasting indoor soccer



beginning in the second year of the original Major Indoor Soccer league when he covered the Buffalo Stallions. He later covered the Columbus Capitals of the American Indoor Soccer Association, and spent four years as a color analyst and play-by-play voice of the Buffalo Blizzard of the National Professional Soccer League. A long time broadcaster of high school football in Western New York, he also spent several seasons as the color analyst for NCAA Division I University at Buffalo football and as the play-by-play announcer for UB basketball. Most recently, he is serving as a play-by-play voice for the Florida State High School Athletic Association's girl's and boy's basketball championships, boy's and girl's lacrosse championships and softball championships. He worked for almost five years as Athletic Director at Hilbert College, an NCAA Division III school in Hamburg, N.Y, helping found the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference of which the Hawks are members still to this day.

Arena soccer is a fast-paced game with lots of action from end to end. Although similar to the outdoor game, arena soccer has a number of modifications.

Number of Players on the Field – Each team plays with five field players and a goalkeeper, only the goalkeeper can use his hands and only inside the penalty box. Late in the game, a team that is behind in the score may choose to have a field player substitute in for the goalkeeper to create an attacking advantage. This player is referred to as a 6th Attacker. He will wear a jersey with a different color than his teammates and can use his hands inside his own penalty box. Like hockey, substitutions are allowed “on the fly”, meaning during the normal run of play.

Out of Bounds – Arena soccer is played within walls and the ball is live at all times it is in the field of play. It is very common for players to bounce the ball off the wall as they pass to teammates or create attacking opportunities. If the ball goes over the wall and

into the stands or netting, the ball is considered out of bounds and will be kicked in from the spot nearest where it went out of bounds.

Penalties -- Fouls committed during MASL games are penalized with a direct kick, if the foul is severe enough, the referee may show the player who committed the foul a blue, yellow or red card. Penalties can range from boarding, tripping, to contact of the head or shoulders to dangerous play etc.

Blue Card -- A Blue Card indicates a two-minute timed penalty. The committing player will have to spend two minutes in the penalty box. His team will not be able to replace him on the field during those two minutes, resulting in a 'Power Play ' man advantage for the opposing team. If a goalkeeper receives a Blue Card, his team can choose another field player to serve his penalty for him. If his team is scored on before the two minutes expire, the player is excused from the remainder of the timed penalty.

Yellow Card -- A Yellow Card indicates a Misconduct Penalty and results in the committing player spending five minutes in the Penalty Box. A player serving a Misconduct Penalty can be replaced on the field and his team will not be short-handed. However, when the five minutes has expired, the player can not return to the field until a guaranteed substitution.

Red Card - Violent conduct, serious foul play and penalty accumulation are some of the reasons a referee might show a Red Card, resulting in the committing player's immediate ejection from the game. Following the ejection, the committing team will send a different player to serve a two-minute timed player and his team will not be able to replace him on the field during those two minutes, resulting in a 'Power Play ' man advantage for the opposing team.

Time of Game - Arena soccer games are four quarters in length, 15 minutes per quarter. Unlike outdoor soccer, it is not a running clock. The clock stops at various points including when the ball goes out of play, on fouls, and after goals. There is a 15-minute halftime. If the score is tied after the end of four quarters, a 10 minute "golden goal" overtime period will be played. If no goal is scored in the overtime period, the game will be decided by a three-player shootout.

Miscellaneous - Goals are inset into the boards at each end of a typical field, which is 200 feet long and 85 feet wide. Goals are 14 feet wide and eight feet in height ... The visiting team has possession for kickoffs in the first and third quarters; the home team in the second and fourth. Play restarts (after the ball leaves the playing area) with a kick-in or a corner kick or distribution from the goalkeeper ... Corner kicks are taken if the ball leaves the playing area between the two flags on the goal line, having been last touched by the defending team. The goalkeeper will distribute the ball if the ball leaves the playing area between the two flags on the goal line, having been last touched by the attacking team. Kickins are taken when the ball leaves the field of play at any other area and will be put back in play by the opposing team at the point the ball left the field

longitudinally between flags or top of arc if directly out in the defensive zone ...Balls must cross the goal line in their entirety in order to count as a goal.



With a renewed emphasis on integrating the vision, goals and working relationship between Major Arena Soccer League and M2, the leagues have adopted a formal player agreement that allows for players in M2 to move to the MASL and vice versa. There are three parts to the agreements covering players on M2 teams that already have MASL sides, players that play for M2 teams that have a formal affiliation with a MASL team, and players who play for M2 teams with no MASL affiliation at the current time. Following are the highlights of the player agreements for each situation.

>> M1 Team That Owns M2 Team

M1 teams that own an M2 team(s) will be allowed to have up to five (5) players sign a dual contract at the beginning of the M1 season. This contract will allow the player(s) to be signed with both their M1 and M2 teams.

Two of those five players will be considered their M1/M2 Designated Players (DP). These two (2) Designated Players (DP) will be allowed to play with either their M1 or M2 team for an unlimited number of games throughout the regular M1/M2 season and/or playoffs. Once these two Designated Players (DP) are selected they cannot be changed on the M1/M2 rosters unless they have a season ending injury, are traded, or have been released by either or both clubs.

The other three dual contract players will become the Limited Designated Players (LDP) and will be allowed to play for both their M1 and M2 teams up until their twelfth (12th) M1 game played. Once they have played in their 12th M1 game, they must be replaced on the LDP list and can no longer play any M2 games.

>> M1 Teams with official M2 Team Affiliations

M1 teams that have an affiliation with any M2 teams will be allowed to have up to five players sign a dual contract with both their M1 and affiliated M2 teams at the beginning of the M1 season.

Two of those five players will be considered their M1/M2 Designated Players (DP). These two Designated Players (DP) will be allowed to play with either their M1 or affiliated M2 team for an unlimited number of games throughout the regular M1/M2 season and/or playoffs. *Once these two Designated Players (DP) are selected they cannot be changed on the M1/M2 rosters unless they have a season ending injury, are traded, or have been released by either or both clubs.

The other three dual contract players will become the Limited Designated Players (LDP) and will be allowed to play for both their M1 and M2 affiliated teams up until their 12th M1 game played. Once they have played in their 12th M1 game, they must be replaced on the LDP list and can no longer play any affiliated M2 team games.

M1 Team with No M2 Ownership / Affiliation

If during the M1 season an M1 team wants to sign a loan for a registered M2 player from an M2 team that is not a direct affiliate to that M1 team, the M1 team must pay to the M2 team a transfer fee and cover the M2 player expenses. To be accepted, the M2 team must agree to the terms of the loan before the M2 player will be allowed to join the M1 team.

The M2 player may be loaned for a minimum two game week period, and/or maximum four games. While under this loan agreement, the M2 team must gain approval from the M1 team should they want their loaned M2 player to also play in an M2 game(s) during the duration of the M1 loan period.

The M2 player may be loaned for a maximum of two loan periods.

The M2 player will only be allowed to play in a maximum of eight M1 games while on loan. If the M1 team intends to extend past the eight M1 game loan, then the M1 team will need to pay an additional transfer fee or purchase the M2 player contract from their prospective M2 team.

If an M1 team wants to buy a non-affiliated M2 player directly without a loan, then the transfer fee is paid by the purchasing M1 team to the selling M2 team.
