GAME RECAPS: Rochester became only the fifth team in league history to record a perfect record - the lowa Demon Hawks turned the same trick this year as well - in finishing its regular season with a sweep of Utica's United Elite Krajisnik FC. On Friday, Rochester led just 4-3 at intermission, but the Lancers defense pitched a shutout in the second half for their 11th straight win. Rochester outshot United Elite 41-30. Jakeb Mitchell and Alastair Farmer both played in goal for Rochester, with Farmer going 37 minutes in picking up his fourth win of the year. Three Lancers had a goal and an assist each including Rookie of the Year candidate Ali Alomori, Alex Harling and Augustus Finn. Damon Almazon had two goals for United Elite. On Saturday, Rochester raced to a 4-0 lead after 15 minutes, and were dominant throughout, outshooting the visitors 60-20, including by a margin of 35-7 in the second half. In fact, despite the lopsided loss, United Elite netminder Julian Rodrigues was named the games third





star for his 23 save performance. Jakeb Mitchell was the game's second start as he was credited with 10 saves for Rochester in notching his eighth win of the season. Player/Coach Jake Schindler led the attack with two goals and two assists. Taner Bay had two goals and MASL veteran Darren Toby chipped in with a goal and an assist. Mitchell lost his shutout try on a third-quarter goal from Elizandaro Vieira.

GAME RECAPS: These two teams split this past weekend's doubleheader, and will close the M2 regular season next weekend with a game at Towson Arena on Saturday as part of a pro indoor soccer doubleheader with their parent team. the MASL Baltimore Blast, hosting Utica City FC at 6 p.m. EDT. This past Saturday, Orlando never trailed after Rodrigo Kauffman gave Atletico a 2-1 lead just over two minutes into the second quarter. On three different occasions after that, Baltimore was able to pull within one goal but never did find the equalizer. Jordan Travers made it a 6-5 game with 3:28 to play, but Orlando closed out the game with two scores, including one against a sixth attacker, and the true back breaker, a shorthanded tally by Eduardo Cruz with 1:52 left in the fourth. Juan Reyes had two goals and one assist for Orlando, while Kaufman and Cruz finished with two goals each. Charly Vargas added two assists. Erik Lorent had two goals for Baltimore, who outshot Orlando 35-27. On Sunday, it was just as tight. Baltimore never trailed after taking a 3-2





lead with just over a minute left in the first period from Michael Bernstein. Orlando forged tie scores on two occasions after that, but never did lead the rest of the way. Orlando outshot Baltimore 34-30. Joe Stefoi had two goals and two assists to lead the Arsenal attack, while Brayde Wise had a hat trick. Kauffman had a hat trick for Orlando.

TAMPA, Florida -- Indoor soccer fans have a million reasons to be excited about the latest addition to Major Arena Soccer League 2.

The team will participate in Major Arena Soccer League 2 and will play seven home games on turf at the Danbury Ice Arena in Connecticut beginning in winter of 2024-25.

Matt and Adriana Svanda, also owners of Newtown Pride FC in Newtown, Connecticut, have spearheaded the effort in Danbury.

"Bringing a fast paced, energy driven brand of soccer to Danbury is something we think is a perfect fit for this city," said owner and general manager Matt Swanda. "The game of soccer is a true passion of ours and we try and use it as a catalyst of good. We're confident that in partnership with the Danbury Ice Arena, we will be able to bring an incredible experience and different brand of soccer to fans both new and old."

In 2023, it was Newtown Pride FC who took America by surprise creating an instantly iconic national soccer memory with their win in the inaugural million-dollar winner-take-all TST tournament. The Pride will be partaking in this years TST tournament in June to be aired on ESPN.

"What better place than Danbury, bringing a global game to a city with a diverse set of individuals and cultures. Our team is planning to create an atmosphere that is one of the best in minor league sports – it is our commitment that you won't just be coming to a soccer game – but an event. Onua Obasi will be the head coach. Obasi, who has extensive experience within the MASL as a player, is committed to Spice City FC. Obasi has played with the Baltimore Blast, Utica City FC and the Empire Strykers, appearing in 78 total games in the Major Arena Soccer League, with 22 goals and 25 assists.

"I'm thankful for the Svanda family for trusting me in this role and am excited to get to work. My commitment is to building a team that our city can be proud of, and deliver a brand of soccer that fans will be excited to be in their seats at kickoff for," Obasi said.
