

THE GAME



Friday, March 15, 7:30 p.m. CDT IOWA RAPTORS (5-5) at IOWA DEMON HAWKS (11-0) Buccaneer Arena, Des Moines, Iowa



GAME NOTES: The Hawkeye State rivalry renews one more time in Des Moines as the Demon Hawks look to complete what would be the fourth perfect regular season in league history. In three previous meetings, the Hawks have takes wins by 11-3, 16-2 and 11-7 on Dec. 8. in Des Moines, the hosts raced to a 9-3 halftime lead. Diego Pantuza had three goals and two assists. On Iowa just led 4-2 after 15 minutes in Cedar Rapids on Jan. 20, but scored 12 goals – led by seven by Ricardo Diegues who went on to sign with the MASL Baltimore Blast – to win by 14. Most recently, on Feb. 25, also in Cedar Rapids, eading scorer Ricardo Diegues was out, but it was no problem for the highest scoring team in M2 who won its 10th straight in preparation for the league's playoffs April 4-7 in Wichita. The Demon Hawks led just 2-1 after 15 minutes, but stretched that to 6-3 at intermission and Rainer Hauss did the rest from there, shutting out the Raptors in the second half to pick up his league-leading 10th win in goal. Luan Silva led the Demon Hawks attack with three goals and two assists while Bruno Henrique added three goals and one assist. Lucas Nascimento contributed with two goals and one assist. The Demon Hawks have scored a league high 136 games. Rochester is second with 116 but has played in two fewer games so far. Henrique leads the offense with 20 goals and 19 assists, while Hauss leads the league in saves percentage (.815), wins (10) and is second in goals against (4.14) among M2 netminders.

<u>GAME NOTES:</u> Rochester is looking to complete what would be the fifth team in league history to record a perfect regular season – the lowa Demon Hawks are also looking to turn that trick this weekend – in games that will impact who is runner up in the East this spring. That team, along with Rochester who has already clinched the division and playoff spot, will head to Wichita April 4-7 for the M2 playoffs. This is the

fourth meeting between the two, with Rochester taking wins of 14-6, 12-3 and 15-5. On January 13 in Baltimore, Rochester got four goals and an assist from Joey Tavernese (now injured) in the 14-6 decision. On Feb. 23 and 24 in Rochester, the Lancers continued their march through the Eastern Division, piling up 27 goals in a two-game sweep of the Baltimore Arsenal over the weekend, The Arsenal trailed just 4-2 at the half on Friday before the Lancers pulled away., thanks in part to 50 shots on goal (while allowing just 26). Ali Alomari led the Lancers with three goals and two assists while Matt D'Amico had a hat trick and an assist. Ryan Curtis chipped in with two goals and Jakeb Mitchell picked up the win in goal, credited with seven saves. On Saturday, Rochester ended the suspense early by scoring five goals in the game's first seven minutes; Baltimore never got closer than three goals the rest of the way. Alomari again had a big night with four goals and one assist while Davinson Diaz had three goals and one assist. Curtis and D'Amico each also added two goals. Mitchell picked up another win as the Lancers outshot the visitors, 57-34. For Baltimore, Brayde Wise scored twice while teammate Eric Lorent had a goal and an assist. Rochester has 116 goals in nine games, while their netminder, Jakeb Mitchell, has the league's leading goals against average at 3.77. Alomari leads the attack with 26 goals and 11 assists, including four game winners.

GAME NOTES: Orlando can vault themselves right back into the playoff picture with a big weekend, while United Elite looks to move towards a runner up spot in the East and a trip to the M2 playoffs. These two teams have met twice already in Utica, the first weekend in January, with United Elite winning the games by a combined three goals. Both games were tight, back and forth affairs, as demonstrated by Saturday's opener., won by Orlando 9-7. Utica led 2-1 after one, it was tied 4-4 at half, and 6-6 going to the final 15 minutes. Orlando grabbed a quick upper hand in the fourth with two goals less then a minute apart when Daniel Vielma and Lucas Pietroluongo De Oliveira found the back of the net, part of a four-goal run by the visitors. Olivera scored three time to led the Atletico attack, while Eduardo Cruz scored twice. Alexander Gomez had a hat trick for United Elite, while Ricky added a pair. On Sunday, the hosts jumped out to a 3-0 lead, and then led 5-2, before Orlando closed the gap late. Victor Rada was the game's offensive star, getting four of Orlando's five goals. Douglas Barrera Tanes and Jayce Berger had two each for United Elite Krajisnik, who got the game winner from Dragan Cvetkovic with just 32 seconds to play. Victor Rada leads Orlando with six goals in as many games. Tyler Forbes is leading the Utica attack with nine goals and two assists.

GAME NOTES: This should be an entertaining matchup, with two teams that have their sights set on playing beyond the end of the regular season. This is only the second meeting of the season, and that was an pre-season game in Amarillo that the Bombers scored a 10-8 win in. Pablo Magallanes had two goals and two assists for Amarillo, while David Trevizo had a hat trick. Mario Arrieta had a hat trick for El Paso, who can still earn a playoff spot by being one of the top two third place teams in the league's three divisions. Rene Loya, who played for last year's Chiahuahua Savage 2 that won the league crown, has fit in nicely in Amarillo with 29 goals and nine assist to lead the Bombers. Trevizo has added 22 goals.

GAME NOTES: The Wings will get a playoff tuneup on the road as New Mexico looks to finish a tough-luck season on a high noted. The Runners had one of their best performances of the season on March 8, losing to Wichita just 11-8. The Wings raced to a 6-1 lead and while the Runners threw a late scare into Wichita, they were able to notch their ninth win in 10 starts. Knocking on the door early and often, the Wings led 4-1 after one, and 6-3 at intermission. Setting the pace for Wichita was a quartet of four players who all had three points apiece: Guilherme Oliveira (three goals), Mershad Ahmadi (three goals), Taylor Henry (goal and two assists), Jared Robins (two goals and one assist). Making it close for New Mexico was Josh Garcia, who did not score but dished out four assists, while teammates Nick Famiglietta and Vince Aragon added a goal and assist each. Over the full 60 minutes, goaltender Jose Campo continued his stellar work for the Wings, recording 13 saves in picking up his ninth win of the season. Making the start in goal for New Mexico, Max Yaeger saw 20 shots come his way, while the Runners had 22 on Campo. On February 3 in Wichita, the Wings had an 8-1 lead at intermission and were never threatened in a 13-3 victory. David Lucia had three goals and two assists and Caique Trivelato had a goal and four assists to lead the Wings. Wichita goaltender Jose Ocampo, the league's Defensive Player-of-the-Month for February, is third in goals against, second in saves percentage, and second in wins in M2 this season so far.

GAME NOTES: St. Louis will close with its third home game of the season on Sunday as part of a St. Patrick's Day doubleheader with their parent team in the MASL who will host rival Kansas City in a 3:05 CDT kickoff The Ambush 2 and Raptors are playing for the fourth time this year, with Iowa winning twice. All the games were in Cedar Rapids, and all in December. On Dec. 22 and 23, St. Louis logged their first ever win in M2 - their parent team is now in its 11th year in the Major Arena Soccer League - with a 12goal outburst in Friday's first game of the weekend doubleheader. It was a close game throughout, tied at 3 all after the first guarter and 5-5 at intermission. The Ambush 2 took an 8-7 lead to the final 16 minutes and put the game out of reach with a four-goal fourth. MASL Ambush veteran Lucas Almeida suited up for this one, and banged in five goals while adding two assists. Tristan Austin had a three-point effort with a goal and two assists while Luyanda Nogenda added two goals. Nico Williams and Jan Kearney each scored twice for the homestanding Raptors. In taking game two, the Raptors grabbed their first win in three starts this year - after advancing to the M2 Championship game last spring - pulling away with four goals in the fourth guarter. Angelo Oguendo led the Iowa offense with three goals, assisting on a fourth, while Isaiah Thomas chipped in with a pair of goals. The Raptors led 2-0 at intermission, but only 3-2 heading into the final 15 minutes. On Dec. 28, playing each other for the third time in less than a week, the Raptors ended up taking two of three from the first-year Ambush 2, building an early lead and never really letting the Ambush get up to speed. The homestanding Raptors managed to score nine goals on just 21 shots, while allowing just 12 shots on goal by St. Louis. Bobby Hurwitz ended up getting what turned out to be the game winning goal, breaking a 1-1 first quarter tie with his goal with just over two minutes to play in the first. The Raptors extended their advantage to 5-1 at the half, with all four of Iowa's remaining goals coming in the third quarter. Haakon Utesch went the distance in goal for the winners, posting an .875 saves percentage as the Raptors did not allow a goal in the game's final 50-plus minutes. Angelo Oquendo led the lowa offense with a goal and three assists. Nico Williams had two goals and Hurwitz also added an assist. Aamahn Murvin got the lone St. Louis goal. Coming into Sunday, Perez had 15 goals and five assists for St. Louis.

TAMPA, Florida -- Indoor soccer fans have a million reasons to be excited about the latest addition to Major Arena Soccer League 2.

The Danbury Ice Arena alongside partners of Spice City Futbol Club, LLC have announced Danbury's newest professional sports team – Spice City FC. The team will participate in Major Arena Soccer League 2 and will play seven home games on turf at the Danbury Ice Arena in Connecticut beginning in winter of 2024-25.

Matt and Adriana Svanda, also owners of Newtown Pride FC in Newtown, Connecticut, have spearheaded the effort in Danbury.

"Bringing a fast paced, energy driven brand of soccer to Danbury is something we think is a perfect fit for this city," said owner and general manager Matt Swanda. "The game of soccer is a true passion of ours and we try and use it as a catalyst of good. We're confident that in partnership with the Danbury Ice Arena, we will be able to bring an incredible experience and different brand of soccer to fans both new and old."

In 2023, it was Newtown Pride FC who took America by surprise creating an instantly iconic national soccer memory with their win in the inaugural million-dollar winner-take-all TST tournament. The Pride will be partaking in this years TST tournament in June to be aired on ESPN.

Kyle Lyddy, President of Operations for the organization, said the MASL 2 franchise was a natural extension of the club.

"Partnering with Herm Sorcher and the Danbury Ice Arena is the perfect setting to launch our brand to bring people together,' Luddy noted. "What better place than Danbury; bringing a global game to a city with a diverse set of individuals and cultures. Our mantra "You Belong Here" is a call to excite people to get in the building to witness high energy goals and a fast-paced brand of soccer we can all rally around. Our team is planning to create an atmosphere that is one of the best in minor league sports – it is our commitment that you won't just be coming to a soccer game – but an event. Onua Obasi will be the head coach. Obasi, who has extensive experience within the MASL as a player, is committed to Spice City FC. Obasi has played with the Baltimore Blast, Utica City FC and the Empire Strykers, appearing in 78 total games in the Major Arena Soccer League, with 22 goals and 25 assists.

"I'm thankful for the Svanda family for trusting me in this role and am excited to get to work. My commitment is to building a team that our city can be proud of, and deliver a brand of soccer that fans will be excited to be in their seats at kickoff for," Obasi said.
