GAME NOTES: Rochester has already clinched the East Division title, and will be looking to become the fifth team in M2's seventh season to complete a perfect regular season. There are only games reamining in the East - the Midwest and North have already completed their regular season - so two playoff spots remain up for grabs. One will go to the runners up in the East, and the last spot to the third place team with the best record. Amarillo already has one of those wild card spots, These two teams have met twice previously, with the Lancers winning both. On January 21 in Utica, the Lancers scored an 11-4 win. Breaking open a close early game with four unanswered goals in the second quarter, the Rochester Lancers rolled to their second win in as many starts. The visitors held a lead of 7-2 at intermission, and were not threatened. Ali Alomari led the way with four goals while Joey Tavernese had three and Alex Harling two. One week later, the two tangled in Utica again, with the Lancers prevailing 11-6. In this one, Utica's United Elite Krajisnik opened on fire, scoring the first four goals of the game, only to see Rochester storm back with nine of the game's next 10 goals. Ali Alomari led Rochester with two goals and three assists. Tanner Bay added three goals and Matt D'Amico had two goals and an assist. For United Elite, Jayce Berger had two goals and two assists. Alastair Farmer picked up his first win of the season in goal for the Lancers. Coming into the weekend, Rochester is led in goal by Jakeb Mitchell, second in the league in in goals against average at 4.26, third in saves percentage at .689 and tied for third in wins with seven. Offensively, they are led by Alomari with 26 goals and 11 assists. Taner Bay has 17 goals and seven assists. For United Elite, Tyler Forbes leads in both goals and points with 11 and 14 respectively.

GAME RECAP: These two teams, along with United Elite, are still alive for the playoffs. The second place team in the East will qualify, along with one additional third place finisher in either the East or North. Amarillo, the third place finisher in the Midwest, is already assured of a spot. These two teams have not played each other yet this year, but will finish the season against each other with doubleheaders this weekend and next in Maryland. Orlando, by agreement of all the teams in the East, joined M2 this year and played all its games on the road while they prepare a home facility for the 2024-25 season. Leading Orlando is Victor Rada Yibrin with 11 goals in eight starts. Erik Lorent with three goals and four assists is pacing the Baltimore attack.

"I'm thankful for the Svanda family for trusting me in this role and am excited to get to work. My commitment is to building a team that our city can be proud of, and deliver a brand of soccer that fans will be excited to be in their seats at kickoff for," Obasi said.
