Registration Websites

Team Declarations & Registration	The Bountiful coaches will determine the number of teams to be fielded for the season. The Bountiful Trustee will declare the teams at the July UHSB Trustee Board meeting.
Player Registration	Registration is Open. Registration with UHSB <u>must be completed by the first week in August</u> to be eligible for Bountiful team practices and games. Registration deadlines are determined by the State Registrar and USA Hockey, Inc. No exceptions.

Season Fees The team is willing to work out an alternate payment schedule. Reach out to the team trustee right away to discuss payment arrangements. The Bountiful team fee of \$750 will be billed to parents during the TeamSnap registration. Installment payments will be provided. Credit card and ACH payments incur a processing fee.	April 1 – USA Hockey Membership portal opens (\$70-\$81) July 15-Dec 31 – League fee of \$200 with Registration – Online Registration. Bountiful Hockey Grade Checks Policy

Bountiful Hockey players are students first and hockey players second. To remain eligible for full participation on the Bountiful Hockey team, each player must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher, without a failing grade (No "F" grades), during the hockey season. Failure to produce grades as requested will affect a player's eligibility for game participation.

Each player must submit documentation confirming the player's grades immediately after they are posted in the DSD grades portal. Acceptable documentation is the end of term report card. A screenshot of end of term grades that are not reflective of the minimum standard will result in discussion regarding academic corrective action. The team leadership will work with the player and parent to determine a reasonable "return to play" plan.

This grade check is due no later than 5 days after the posting of term grades. The purpose of this requirement is to assure that each player is achieving, at minimum, a 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA), with no failing grades. And, to assist the student athlete who is struggling with their academic commitments. Failure to reach or maintain the minimum grades requirement will result in a player being ineligible for games. The player is still expected to attend team practices while remediating their grades. Families may have a stricter grade policy and withholding of hockey game participation which will be honored by the team leadership when that is the parent's preference. It is an expectation and requirement that players maintain their academic performance while participating on the Bountiful Hockey team. The Player/Parent Agreement and Varsity Letter information cover grades as well.



Bountiful Hockey Player Agreement

As a member of the Bountiful Hockey Program, I will adhere to all requirements of this Player Contract.

- I agree to be honest, forthright, and trustworthy with everyone I interact with when participating in all team activities and when representing my team at events and when wearing team attire. My honesty might result in negative consequences for me or the team but may be the right thing to do.
- I will abide by all policies set forth in my school's Student Handbook and policies. <https://bhs.davis.k12.ut.us/parents-students/student-handbook>

- I will ALWAYS encourage good sportsmanship from players, coaches, officials, and parents.
- We win and lose as a team. I will work hard to be a team player and promote team play.
- I will achieve a minimum 2.0 GPA, without a failing grade; be dedicated to self-improvement; and I am responsible for my hockey skill and academics. The coaches are my leaders, teachers, and mentors.
- I will attend every practice, game, and team activity where I am expected. I will notify my Coach, in advance, if I cannot attend a team activity where I am expected. I understand that communication and accountability, regarding my attendance, is necessary for the coaches to manage practice plans and game rosters. Timely communication regarding attendance is necessary for team volunteers who plan team snacks & meals and team activities/events. I will take responsibility for consequences because I failed to communicate my attendance in a timely manner.
- I will inform myself of the USA Hockey Safesport rules and regulations. See link on the team webpage: <https://www.utahhighschoolhockey.com/bountiful>
- I will listen and learn from my coaches, work hard to improve my skills, learn the rules of the game of hockey, and play by the rules.
- I will treat my coaches, teammates, officials, parents, team volunteers, program volunteers and opponents with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or abilities.
- I will encourage my parents and friends to be involved with my team in a helpful, positive capacity.
- I will not use objectionable language or behavior that is detrimental to the Bountiful Hockey team, Utah High School Hockey, its members/participants/coordinators/officials, or to the game.
- I will wear my full equipment during all practices and games (including mouthguard and neckguard). I will wear the team uniform for games and the team practice jersey at practices, game day wear, as required by my team's rules and the coaches.
- I will adhere to the Varsity team game day dress code of the Bountiful Hockey official warm-ups suit or a clean dress shirt or polo (tucked in, dress pants, and casual dress shoes). The dress code applies while I arrive to games, while I am inside the rink, including after the game on the way to my vehicle/ride home.
- I will respect my teammates and my team by wearing only my Bountiful Hockey jersey, shells, socks and office ice apparel during team activities and not my travel team items during Bountiful hockey activities.
- I will never enter the playing surface or player's bench area while the Zamboni is resurfacing the ice.
- I will not go on the ice until I am instructed by my Coaches or an on-ice official.
- I will use TeamSnap for communicating with my coaches and the team management and I will include my parents on that communication or at least two adults. I will communicate between the hours of 9 am and 9 pm.
- I am responsible for knowing if I am rostered for a game and I know that I may not be allowed to dress or be on the bench for a game where I am not rostered.
- I will not take equipment or other items that does not belong to me. I will not deface or damage equipment, locker rooms, rinks, parking lots, school property, teammate, or opponents' belongings.
- I will abide by the team rules established by the coaching staff and/or team trustee/managers.
- I understand that all members of the Bountiful Hockey – players, parents, volunteers, and coaches – are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship, respectful behavior, honor team values, and support principles of USA Hockey, Utah Amateur Hockey Association, Utah High School Hockey, and Bountiful Hockey.
- I will communicate with my team coaches, managers, trustee, volunteers using TeamSnap and will include my parents or another adult in the communications. I understand that this is a requirement under SafeSport guidelines.
- I will report violations of team, league, governing entities rules to a responsible adult or law enforcement as appropriate.



_____ Player Suspensions: (player initials)

Players may be asked to leave the rink or risk suspension for all or portion of a game or practice, numerous games/practices or for the entire season for USA Hockey, UAHA or League violations. Discipline can be issued for the following reason or other reasons:

- Failure to attend a scheduled team meeting without properly communicating with the Head Coach
- ANY unexcused absence from a scheduled game or practice
- Use of foul or abusive language especially when directed toward any league or rink official, other players, or any team member.
- Violation of the SafeSport mobile device & digital communications regulations. Locker Room violations.
- Disrespect to referees, a visiting hockey team, Officials, rink personnel, or any school official
- Fighting or bullying teammates
- Conduct detrimental to the team as determined by the Coaches and/or Trustee.
- Conduct that may cause harm to an individual, group, team. Can be verbal, physical, digital, or other modalities capable of causing harm.
- Use/Conviction of illegal or prescription drugs that are not my own or alcohol possession/use
- Participation in games or practices while under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol
- Defacing or damaging arena property or teammate(s) property, including locker room "trashing"
- Theft and/or vandalism
- Use of cell phone in the locker room. Transmission or sharing of inappropriate images, texts, emails, digital communications, at any time.
- Receiving a game misconduct, gross misconduct, major or match penalty. Additional discipline may be added by the league, state board, Coach and/or Trustee.
- Bad sportsmanship – observed or reported.
- Failure to pay fees when due.
- Failure to abide by the bylaws, rules and regulations or USA Hockey, Utah High School Hockey, or this Player Contract
- Refusal to obey reasonable requests of the coaches, team volunteers, team managers, officials, captains.
- Failure to abide by USA Hockey, team and league rules/policies, SafeSport rules.
- Conviction of a criminal offense.

School registration, status and attendance:

No player shall be eligible to register or participate on or with the Bountiful High School Hockey team unless they are enrolled in a Utah School district and in good standing. If the School District or the player's school administration suspend or desire a player to be suspended from team participation, that player may be suspended until the school administration indicates the suspension be lifted and the player is in good standing/enrollment with the school. USA Hockey guidelines regarding player suspensions will be followed in these cases. If, during the season a player shall be suspended from or voluntarily leave the school, the player shall be suspended from participating on the team until their continued eligibility can be determined. The player shall be reinstated should they re-enroll in a school within the team boundaries or with approval from the UHSH Board of Trustees, but not before the school has lifted suspension.

Should the player be involuntarily or voluntarily suspended for any reason, they shall have no amount of their registration and other fees repaid or reimbursed. A parent of a player who is disciplined by the school or a rink venue must immediately disclose the suspension to the Bountiful Hockey head coach and team trustee. Failure to disclose a player's disposition with their school in terms of school enrollment, suspension, expulsion, or venue suspension, shall be subject team dismissal. This guideline applies to home-school and online student players. Parents who request that their player be suspended from games, for violation of family rules, will be honored. Players with families with remarriages, guardians, etc., will need to work together to agree on terms. Suspensions apply to games but may not apply to practices. Players are expected to attend practices during their suspension period unless their violation prohibits practice participation. This guideline is strict and intended to keep the team in good standing with the governing hockey entities, academic institutions and to facilitate corrective measures in cooperation with the player and parent(s)/guardian(s), venues, governing entities, schools.

_____ Grades (player initials):

The team adheres to the Davis School District school policies regarding grades and athletics. Players must correct their grades and submit documentation of improvement to minimum thresholds, to continue to participate in team



games and scrimmages. Players are expected to attend practices provided they are not prohibited. The player's report card or acceptable documentation must be submitted to the Head Coach or Trustee within 5 days after the end of each quarter or as requested. A minimum of a 2.0 GPA, without failing grades, mandatory for game play.

All parents, guardians, stepparents, foster parents, etc., of the Bountiful Hockey player are expected to abide by the USA Hockey parent and fan Codes of Conduct and to assure that their player(s) are adhering to the USA Hockey Player Code of conduct. Behavior that violates these standards are subject to discipline or removal from the team. Parents/guardians are responsible for the behavior of their guests.



Bountiful Hockey Parent Contract

As a parent or guardian, I am proud to have my child/ward accepted as a Bountiful Hockey Player. As the Parent/Guardian of a Bountiful Hockey, I hereby understand that it is important for me to support the team by supporting the coaching staff, team volunteers and my Player, by agreeing to the following conditions:

- I agree to treat those I encounter, through my Player's involvement in the Bountiful Hockey program, with respect and courtesy. This specifically includes but is not limited to Hockey Officials, Opposing Parents, Opposing Players, all Coaching Staff, rink staff, Bountiful Hockey parents, fans, volunteers and my Player.
- I understand and agree that as a Parent of a Player I represent Bountiful High, Woods Cross High, or one of the many Jr High programs in Davis County. My actions, either positive or negative, are a reflection of the team, my Player and their school and I will conduct myself in a manner that reflects positively on the Bountiful Hockey program, its participants, supporters and all those associated with Bountiful Hockey.
- I understand that my role as the Parent of a Bountiful Hockey player is one of the most important roles in the success of my player and the Bountiful Hockey Program and as such, I agree to use my power as a Parent to help the coaching staff through positive talk and actions, active participation when requested and allowing the coach staff to coach.
- I understand and agree that as the Parent of a Player, I am a Role Model and an example to my Player and the other players on the team and I will act with maturity and respect at all team activities.
- I agree to learn the rules of hockey; the many strategies utilized to manage a game; the hockey players, the lines, and the entire team.
- I will conduct myself with self-control, at games, events, & practices. This includes keeping my comments regarding the game, officials, coaches, volunteers in a positive tone. I understand that I will be asked to leave the facility should I behave in a manner that is disrespectful to the officials, fans, players, rink personnel, volunteers, the public or disruptive to the game or the offensive to the spectators.
- I understand that I will not always agree with the coaching staff's decisions, nor will I always understand the direction they are taking, but I agree to address my grievances in an honest and respectful manner, using the team communications and directly with the coach, at a time and in a manner that is respectful of the coach and the personal time of the team volunteers. I will be mindful of the time I request of them especially when I am requesting their time above and beyond the hours they are already volunteering toward the Bountiful Hockey team.
- I understand that I may be dissatisfied with coaching decisions and that it is inappropriate for me to speak negatively about a coach, the team, team volunteers, players, or other parents. Such talk is not for good purpose and hurts the team, it hurts high school hockey, and it hurts my player. Engaging in hurtful and defamatory language undermines the team, my player's experience, and the Bountiful Hockey program. I will work toward accepting that sometimes I will need to accept decisions of the coach even when I disagree with the coaching decision.
- I understand that the coach reserves the right to bench my player.
- I will adhere to the 24-hour rule and wait at least 24 hours after an emotionally charged incident, before confronting the coach, team leadership, officials, league leadership, parents, the other team, fans, etc. The 24-hour rule is intended to provide parties, who have a grievance, at least 24 hours to cool down and gather their thoughts for a productive problem-solving discussion at the end of the 24-hour period. The waiting period is also intended to allow parties to remove the immediate emotion and allow the parties to focus on the facts of the grievance and a resolution. Exceptions include immediate danger to those involved. If emergency personnel or law enforcement are required to remedy a situation, I understand that I will render such aid and inform the team trustee and head coach immediately.
- I will refrain from contacting the coaching staff except between the hours of 9 am and 9pm unless there is an emergency involving an injury, life-threatening situation or law enforcement. I understand that the coaching staff has work & family obligations that supersede Bountiful Hockey needs. The exception to these hours is when a player, parent, volunteer, fan, or the team is in danger or at risk of harm. In this latter case, the proper authorities should be immediately engaged.
- I agree to RESPECT, SUPPORT and ENJOY the game of Hockey through cheering positively for the Bountiful team, at EVERY GAME! These high school years go by fast. Enjoy them!
- I agree to be mindful that the Bountiful Hockey games and events are attended by fans of many ages and that foul, derogatory, profane, accusatory language is unacceptable, and I will be asked to leave the building or event area if I engage in such language. I may be barred from all future team activities if I violate this guideline.
- I agree to respect the officials, to accept their judgment and to refrain from yelling or engaging with the officials during or after games.

- I agree to learn the game, the game rules and nuances and refrain from sharing my opinions with the officials and fans, especially in a loud and unwelcome manner.
- I agree to abide by the USA Hockey regulations that limit access to locker room hallways, the playing bench, the ice surface. Except for those who have fulfilled the requirements that allow access to these areas AND have been approved by the head coach and trustee to be allowed to enter these areas.
- I understand that the glass surrounding the ice surface is part of the playing surface and that touching, hanging, or pounding on the glass is grounds for removal from the building and penalty assessed to the team.
- I agree that I will do everything in my power to inform myself of the USA Hockey Parent Code of Conduct and the USA Hockey Fan Code of Conduct and to adhere to its guidance. <https://www.usahockeyrulebook.com/page/show/1015129-codes-of-conduct>
- I will encourage my child to learn and play by the rules.
- I will not embarrass my child by yelling at players, coaches, fans, or officials. I will bring a positive attitude to the rink.
- I understand that should I engage with spectators, officials, players while using negative, derogatory, obscene or offensive language will result in my immediate removal from the venue.
- I will study the rules of the game and support the officials on and off the ice.
- I will applaud good effort in both victory and defeat and enforce the positive points of the game. I will not yell or physically abuse my child after a game or practice. I understand that physical and verbal abuse has no place in youth sports.
- I will recognize my player's skill, understanding of the game, athletic aptitude, and drive. I will allow the coaching staff to develop my player for success at their next level, not based on my desires as a parent.
- I understand that there are many levels of skill on this team; not all players will develop at the same rate, nor will they all aspire to put in the effort needed to advance. Some will struggle with emotional and social development. These issues are age appropriate. Most are temporary. Every player will struggle at some point during their high school hockey seasons. The coaching staff and team leadership will support each player as they struggle with challenges and will work with the player and family, within reason, to help all players overcome slumps and be successful.
- I understand that the coaching staff may request a player leave the team temporarily to get assistance from a professional to address the needs of a player. Or, permanently if the player/parent refuse to address behavioral concerns. The first goal will be to work with the family to address concerns. Should continued participation with the team be in the best interest of the player and not disruptive to the team, acceptable by the team leadership and within the team and league rules, that will be the goal.
- Athletes on "in school" suspension and/or suspended from school or league games will not be able to participate in team games during the suspension period.
- I understand that a player may be transitioned to a different position or line where the coach feels they can continue to contribute to the team, fill a team need and further develop the player's skill. Being a supportive parent by trusting these coaching decisions is necessary. These transitions may be temporary or permanent.
- I will recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them.
- I agree to be responsible for the behavior of the fans that I bring to the rink. This is a USA Hockey expectation.
- I understand that disruptive conduct may result in immediate removal from the venue. Failure to leave the venue when requested may result in law enforcement being dispatched to remove me from the venue.
- Improper use of mobile phones, during team activities and non-team activities can be reason to discipline, suspend or remove players and/or parents from the team. I will familiarize myself with the USA Hockey regulations regarding safe use of mobile phone, camera and recording devices, social media, communications, etc. especially in the locker room area. - Adults including parents, guardians, adult relatives should never engage in communication with a minor athlete without the parent/guardian or adult team personnel included in the correspondence. I understand that consequences of this guideline can lead to immediate discipline including removal from the team and/or USA Hockey. At all times, minor aged athletes are to include two or more adults on communications (texts, emails, chats) for the protection of all parties.
- Accusations against a minor athlete, by an adult, should be undertaken using the reporting mechanisms provided by the USA Hockey Safesport program or law enforcement as indicated by the nature of the incident and should include the parent or legal guardian, provided that doing so does not put the minor athlete at risk for harm.

Bountiful Hockey Varsity Letter Requirements

Sportsmanship and Citizenship

Varsity Letters are awarded for individual Bountiful Hockey student athlete achievement. Bountiful Hockey endeavors to create a standard of achievement for earning the Varsity Letter Award. The hockey team varsity letter is awarded by the team and not by the school.

1. The student athlete must be a member of the Varsity squad, for the full season, in good academic, behavioral & financial standing, to be eligible for a Varsity Letter Award. Junior varsity hockey team participation will not count towards the Varsity Letter award.
2. Eligible Players must have demonstrated adherence to the team, league, state and national hockey rules, regulations, policies and standards of the team, league, all hockey governing entities, school & rinks, etc., to be eligible for the Varsity Letter.
3. Eligible players must maintain a 2.0 or GPA or higher, throughout the season, and have completed each term with all passing grades. Players earning an "F", on their report card, are not eligible for a Varsity Letter Award during that academic year and season. The varsity head coach may adjust the minimum GPA upwards at his/her discretion. The students report card must be submitted to the Head Coach or Trustee within 5 days of the end of the term. Players on Academic Probation are not eligible for the Varsity Letter Award. Players declining to submit a report card for verification of grades are not eligible for the Varsity Letter Award. Varsity Letters are not awarded for Summer League participation.
4. Eligible players will exhibit leadership & skills demonstrating their willingness to be a team player. Eligible players are those that assist other players and coaching staff to benefit player and team development. Eligible players exhibit determination to improve one's skill during team practices/trainings AND outside of the team practices/trainings.
5. Players with a disciplinary record with school, law enforcement or the team may not be eligible for a Varsity Letter Award.
6. Bountiful Hockey Varsity players are expected to attend all team activities to be eligible for a varsity letter award. The coaching staff will evaluate the player's attendance at all team activities and practices, character, contributions, and conduct of each player, to determine if he/she will be eligible for the Bountiful Hockey varsity Letter.

Discipline

1. Athletes are reminded that the Varsity Letter is a recognition award determined by the Head Coach. Players' behavior on and off the ice will be taken in consideration when awarding the Bountiful Hockey Varsity Letter.
2. Unsportsmanlike acts or inappropriate behavior by student athletes, in and outside of school, will be reviewed for disciplinary actions and may result in disqualification of Varsity Letter Award.
3. Athletes on "in school" suspension and/or suspended from school or league games will not be able to participate in team games during the suspension period. Suspensions may affect a player's eligibility for a Varsity Letter.

Players and their parent(s) are expected to disclose situations when their player is suspended from school, rinks or school activities due to academic concerns, behavioral issues or disciplinary incidents. These dispositions may affect a player's eligibility for the Varsity Letter award.



Community Service

1. Community service is an integral part of healthy society. Helping others creates and helps maintain a high standard of excellence both in sports and daily life. A team dedicated to each other, as well as their community, creates long lasting friendships and partnerships.
2. Bountiful Hockey Players are required to attend at least one community service activity during the season. The team will host at least one community service activity. If unable to attend, a player is expected to engage in at least one community service activity on their own and report it to the head coach and trustee.
3. Fundraising is required to purchase and maintain equipment, cover ice time and other team costs. Player fees do not cover the entire cost of hosting a Bountiful Hockey Varsity and JV team.

Players must attend the required team events below unless the Player has an excused absence which has been communicated to the Varsity Head Coach, in advance of the team event:

100% – Scheduled On-Ice Practices – Approx. 2 times per week,

100% – Varsity Games - There are approx. 14 Regular Season games scheduled. 100% –

Team Meetings (include chalk talks, Game review, team meals, gear checks) 100% –

Dryland practices - will be scheduled weather permitting.

100% – Community Service / Fundraising - Once coordinated; these events will be posted. Our goal is to host at least one event per season with full team participation

The following events are discouraged and may result in consequence for the player:

Unexcused absences (failure to communicate in advance, excessive absences or notification after the fact)

"Game Misconduct" penalty/penalties

"Gross Misconduct" penalty/penalties

"Fighting" penalty/penalties

Match Penalty/penalties – 50+ Penalty minutes or more

Repeated, substantiated reports of incidents that are obscene, vulgar, off color, racists, sexist, in nature.

Reports of negative talk, taunting, mean-spirited treatment of teammates, coaches, opponents, officials, rink staff, parent volunteers and others involved in managing and supporting youth hockey.

Grade Point Average

Players must maintain a GPA of 2.0 with no failures at the end of each term. Grades submitted to the Head Coach or Trustee within 5 days of the end of the term to be eligible for a Varsity Letter award and continued participation.

Other

Consideration may be granted when a player shows exceptional effort to improve behavior or a player that consistently demonstrates behavior that includes sportsmanship, hustle, respect to coaches, players, and officials, opponents, behaving and speaking with good purpose, etc.).

Final approval for a Bountiful Hockey Varsity Letter is at the discretion of the Bountiful Hockey Head Coaches.



A WORD FROM THE TEAM LEADERSHIP

Thank you for supporting your hockey player in their recreation hockey journey. Participate in the high school hockey program is a big financial and time commitment. The team leadership declares a high school hockey team, each season, with the goal of partnering with every family to provide a good experience for every player, parent, family, and fan. Working with the team leadership will make your families' high school hockey story an enjoyable and memorable one.

The team leadership is accountable to the Utah High School Hockey board of trustees, the Utah Amateur Hockey Association, and the USA Hockey federation. We are accountable to the administration of each of the schools that feed players into the team. These entities have rules, regulations, and expectations regarding the operations of the team and the behavior of the players, parents, and fans. This parent and player agreement attempts to capture those expectations and requirements, conduct, and consequences. It is not exhaustive and could never anticipate all the potential scenarios possible in Utah high school hockey.

This document has grown from two pages to nearly 20 pages due, in part, to the need to address the growing disruptive behavior of participants, coaches, parents, and fans. We appreciate the time it will take to familiarize you with the standards imposed on the team, its leadership, players and you as a parent spectator.

The increase in rules, regulations, and requirements are aimed at regaining a safe and enjoyable youth athletic experience. Recommendations by local governing authorities, have caused our participation Agreement to swell. Consequences for violations over the past several seasons have increased as well. There is a greater expectation that teams do more to manage team & spectator conduct.

Volunteer coaches and team volunteers are being held accountable for the conduct of parents, fans, and players. Discipline leveled on coaches, managers, and teams is more frequent and more punitive than ever before. This player and parent agreement/contract is intended to educate parents and players of their role in being decent & supportive hockey citizens. It describes behavioral boundaries and expectations. We ask that you educate yourselves on the rules of the game recognize the developmental stage of your player, understand training modalities and limiting factors; respect people and rules, the venues, property and academic institutions so that we can keep the team in good standing and thriving.

We need to visit the issue of conduct more often these days. We ask that every player, parent, and volunteer exercise some restraint when things do not go their way. We seem go sideways with coaching decisions and officiating calls, both which hit an emotional nerve. There are tools provided to appropriately communicate concerns and there is law enforcement for filing criminal complaints. Ask the team trustee for guidance.

The league is experiencing the most inexperienced officials ever as the seasoned officials leave the game due, in part, to the conduct of the spectators, players and coaches. Use the mechanisms provided to give constructive feedback to the officials. Yelling at officials is not acceptable. Please find a sensible strategy to manage your dissatisfaction and a communication style that does not jeopardize the team, the league, or your player's participation. If you do not know to whom and how to issue a grievance, contact the team Trustee for guidance.

The standards herein are reasonable, achievement-focused, inclusive of player safety, mindful of the players' academic priorities and steeped in accountability. If you have feedback or desire an explanation as to the purpose for some of the language herein, please reach out to the team Trustee and Head Coach.

We want every player to have great high school hockey memories. Your players' experience will be that which they make of it. They all advance their hockey skills, albeit some faster than others. The coaching staff will move your player along the developmental spectrum and extend more challenging opportunities as your player acquires a higher level of skill, hockey sense, confidence, **and** as spots open on higher roster lines. A coach will not move your player up to varsity if it is not safe. Reach out to the coach to understand their guideline on player safety in game situations.

Support your hockey player. Help your player measure their progress against themselves rather than against another player. Are they a more controlled skater, have they improved their puck protection, outlet passes, back-checks, anticipation, pass completions, etc. Coaches do not make superstars. Each player is in control of their success, not a teammate, not the coach. We always encourage players to get training outside of the team's practices. Exposing your player to different coaching styles may result in progress.

Player talent varies on the Utah high school hockey teams. Some 9th graders will be more advanced than 12th graders. The varsity team will play the top players more often. The JV team will rotate players more evenly. Coaches will make line adjustments throughout the season. Varsity roster spots are not automatic, they are earned. Many factors go into who is on Varsity and who is on JV. Reach out to the head coach to understand where your player stands and recommendations for skill development.

Bountiful Hockey coaches are available to have discussions with parents and players. They love it when players ask what they can do to improve, during practice or through TeamSnap. Repeated requests for meetings from the same parent/family, about the same issue will not be honored. We empathize with the frustration over coaching/rostering decisions. Berating a coach at the rink, in the parking lot with other parents, or in written form will not advance your player. Only your player can put in the effort to advance themselves. Be realistic, not every player has exceptional athletic talent. Coaches will no longer schedule parent meetings before or after practices. Those requests have resulted in shortchanging the rest of the team's practice time. Coaches and managers are volunteers with job and family demands that come first. If there is an immediate or pending safety issue that has someone's well-being at risk or in harm's way, please reach out immediately to the team trustee, or report the issue to the proper law enforcement entity. In general, correspondence with the coaching staff and team managers between the hours of 9 am and 9 pm. They will aim to answer in approximately the next 48 hours and after the coach has tended to work, travel, & family obligations. Again, if there is immediate danger to someone, contact law enforcement. We know that this communication standard is not ample for every parent/guardian, and we understand if families choose to leave the team as a result. Leaving the Bountiful Hockey team does not guarantee placement on a different team.

We are fortunate to have a dedicated volunteer coaching staff. They coach because they love the game, and they want to impart that enthusiasm to your player. Coaches like to win too but they are not here solely to play the same players over and over with the hopes of winning all the games. That mentality is for travel hockey teams. If you see a Bountiful coach failing to roll the JV lines as evenly as possible, reach out to the team trustee for corrective action.

We hope that each player loves this game and parents/guardians are involved because they enjoy watching their player make friends, learn new skills and experience the satisfaction working hard.

The Utah High School Hockey Board of Trustees has approved Bountiful Hockey for one Varsity and one JV team.

Thank you for the effort it will take to get your player to the rink for the early morning practices. And thank you, in advance, for committing to partner with the team leadership for a successful Bountiful Hockey season and your player(s).
