Series History

The Strykers hold a 5-0 all-time record (0-0 in overtime/shootout wins) against the Ambush. Even though both sides were founded in 2013, they did not play each other until the 2019-20 MASL campaign. After not facing St. Louis all of last season, Empire earned an 8-7 victory at St. Louis in the two teams' first meeting of the current campaign on December 9, 2023. The Strykers and the Ambush have never met in the playoffs.

The Stakes

In Sunday's encounter, the Strykers aim to end a three-game losing streak and restore a bit of hope for a postseason berth. Sitting one spot outside the Western Conference playoff picture in fifth, Head Coach Paul Wright's men trail by



a full nine points behind both the fourth-place Tacoma Stars and the third-place Chihuahua Savage, who have two games and one game in hand on Empire, respectively. The Strykers' self-imposed goal for the current campaign is to return to the knockout rounds following consecutive absences.

Having missed the postseason in eight of its ten seasons in existence, including in 2022-23, the Ambush appears headed for the same fate this time around. Halfway through its schedule of matches, the Eastern Conference outfit finds itself two spots below the line in sixth. While St. Louis has played one fewer game than third-place Milwaukee, the Wave boasts a whopping 16-point advantage. Fourth-place Kansas City holds a 14-point cushion, and even fifth-place Baltimore is four points ahead with two more games left than the Ambush.

Empire Battles for Playoff Hopes Against Stars, Ambush

'Keeper Gomez: Must "start winning points" to stay in contention

Ontario, Calif. — Heading into another pair of back-to-back Major Arena Soccer League (MASL) games, the Empire Strykers are hanging on to their playoff hopes by a thread. With his side just outside the Western Conference postseason picture in fifth, Strykers 'keeper Brandon Gomez emphasized the importance of every available point going forward. One way for Empire to avoid a third consecutive absence from the knockout rounds would be to overtake fourth-place Tacoma, Thursday's adversary, which holds a six-point cushion and has two games in hand on Head Coach Paul Wright's men.

The 2-8-0 (wins-losses-overtime/shootout losses) Strykers travel to take on the 4-4-0 Stars on January 25 at 7:05 p.m. PT, followed by a home match against the St. Louis Ambush on Sunday, January 28, at 4:05 p.m. PT. Tickets for the crucial clash with the Ambush are available at www.tixr.com/groups/theempirestrykers, and both upcoming games will be streamed live on Twitch. Thursday's away meeting with the Stars is a classic six-pointer, as a fourth consecutive Strykers loss would put them at a nine-point disadvantage compared to both Tacoma and the third-place Chihuahua Savage, provided the Savage downs visiting bottom dwellers Dallas Sidekicks on Friday. Defending MASL champion Chihuahua has one game in hand on Empire.

The Strykers most recently fell 8-5 at home to long-time rival San Diego Sockers. The match featured a fiercely-contested opening half in which Sockers backstop Boris Pardo demonstrated why he is counted among the best in the league. Empire then fell victim to yet another subpar third-quarter performance, conceding five straight times, before battling back in the closing period and scoring the final four tallies.

"We looked really good in the first half and things were pretty even," said Strykers netminder Gomez. "Hats off to Boris for making some great saves during that phase. We're frustrated because it's not the first time we've made rookie mistakes and struggled in the third quarter. I think I personally could have stopped one or two more shots to give us a better chance. To our credit, we woke up near the end. With one or two more minutes, who knows, maybe we would have tied it. If we can avoid having a poor stretch in every game, we'll put ourselves in a much better position to get results."

While Gomez is third in the league in saves (120), Empire's defender-turned-forward Stefan Mijatovic sits eighth in blocked opposition shots (19), with defender Israel Sesay (11) holding second place in the Strykers' internal



ranking. Mexican star Marco Fabián is tied for sixth in the MASL in points-per-game average (2.3 in 7 games) and also leads his side in points (16). Mijatovic comes in second on Empire in both categories (1.3 in 10 games and 13 points, respectively) while sharing the team lead in goals with Justin Stinson (9 each). Fabián has the most assists of all Strykers players (8), followed by Gerardo Jurado (7).

Empire's recent roster overhaul has seen the club part ways with most of its veterans and sign a number of younger players, many of them transfers from the outdoor game. Three days prior to the January 17 loss to San Diego, Empire suffered a 7-5 home defeat to Tacoma, having already fallen to the visiting Washingtonians by the same score line in late December. The Stars' target forward, indoor legend Nick Perera, bagged five helpers and one goal across the pair of encounters.

"With every game you play against a team, you become more familiar with their tendencies and their go-to guys," offered 'keeper Gomez. "That's why our lack of experience is a challenge. For a lot of us, our two games against Tacoma were the first two times we saw their players from up close. At this point, we should have a better idea what to expect. We're aware of the threat posed by Nick up top and that he has very good runners working off him. It's something we need to defend more effectively this time around."

While Perera is tops league-wide in both assists (16) and points-per-game average (3.5 in 8 games), he also ranks second in the MASL in points (28) and is tied for fifth in goals (12). Jamael Cox's four helpers are enough for second on the Stars together with Alex Caceres, and the 31-year-old Cox is also runner-up on Tacoma in points-per-game average (1.6 in 7 games) and points (11). Cox shares second place in goals with Alessandro Canale (7 each). Matt Braem has the most blocked opposition shots on the Stars roster (6), trailed by Eddie Na and Chase Hanson (4 each).

Other Tacoma standouts include former Strykers backstop Chris Toth as well as Panamanian legend and 2018 FIFA World Cup veteran Román Torres on defense.

Meanwhile, the 2-7-2 St. Louis Ambush, which sits sixth out of seven in the Eastern Conference, boasts club icon and goalkeeping ace Paulo Nascimento. The seventh-year Ambush man is second in the league in saves (129). His teammate Curtis Kirby leads St. Louis in blocked opposition shots (14), with Wil Nyamsi and Christian Briggs (10 each) sharing second place. William Eskay is his side's undisputed attacking leader, as he tops the roster in goals (10), points (16), points-per-game average (1.8 in 9 games), and assists (6).

Forward Robert Kristo not only has the second-most tallies of all St. Louis players (8) but shares runner-up in points with Lucas Almeida (12 each). Midfielder Almeida trails Eskay in points-per-game average (1.3 in 9 games) and jointly sits second in assists with Billy Stimac and VcMor Eligwe. Recent signing Eligew has earned three helpers in as many matches since his arrival from the Dallas Sidekicks.

Empire earned a victory in its December 9 away meeting with the Ambush, jumping out to a dominant lead before coming under pressure in the final quarter and edging out an 8-7 final score.

Said Strykers 'keeper Gomez, "Although we've focused heavily on Tacoma in training, we've also talked about St. Louis and how important it is to build on the win at their home. That was a close game, but we feel good because we had some really good moments and held on despite going through some lows as well. The top three teams in our conference are starting to pull away, so if we don't start winning points, we'll struggle to keep up. We have to look at every game as though it's a must-win, whether we're up against the top or the bottom of the table."

Empire Suffers Heartbreak in 7-6 Loss at Tacoma

Californians fall late despite attacking magic from Fabián, Stinson

Ontario, Calif. — The Empire Strykers played arguably their best game of the 2023-24 Major Arena Soccer League (MASL) campaign on Thursday evening, only to fall in dramatic fashion to hosts Tacoma Stars. Holding the lead late in the closing quarter, Head Coach Paul Wright's men conceded two goals in quick succession to suffer their fourth consecutive defeat, which sees them drop to 2-9-0 (wins-losses-overtime/shootout losses) on the season.

While Strykers Marco Fabián and Justin Stinson enjoyed standout attacking displays, each bagging a hat-trick and an assist, former Empire goalkeeper Chris Toth powered the Tacoma win with a number of key saves. Toth's teammates Nick Perera and Jamael Cox led their side's attack with three points apiece.

After some impressive possession play by Empire in the opening stages, the Southern Californians took the lead when Stinson drove a low shot inside the right post. Finding themselves defending a power play not long thereafter,



Stinson and company were lucky not to concede the equalizer when an unmarked Cory Keitz sent his seemingly simple finish over the bar. The Stars did capitalize on the man advantage moments later, Cox making it 1-1.

The Strykers subsequently reclaimed the lead, Mexican star Fabián firing home on a Stinson helper, but the home side again showed a strong response and nearly reaped the reward. Empire 'keeper Brandon Gomez rushed off his line and threw himself into the attempted finish by Cox, denying the midfielder his second. Cox would not be denied on a subsequent opportunity, converting an assist from Alex Caceres for a 2-2 score line.

If not for a point-blank block by Toth against Fabián, Empire could have taken the lead yet again. The visitors came even closer to netting their third when forward Abdul Mansaray rounded Toth on a breakaway but drifted too far wide for a shot into the open goal.

The Strykers were punished for the squandered looks in the second period, indoor legend Perera giving Tacoma its first lead on a gorgeous interplay with Cox. However, it would soon be 3-3, as Stinson netted courtesy of a beautiful solo effort and a low drive inside the left upright. Empire then had a pair of golden chances denied by Toth. First, the 34-year-old backstop confronted Harold Hanson one on one, managing to get a touch on the ball and prevent the go-ahead goal. Then, he produced an outstanding foot save to keep out wide-open Strykers captain Israel Sesay.

The old cliché of missed opportunities rang true when Perera muscled Fabián off the ball on a counterattack and rifled a bullet into the upper ninety to give the Stars a 4-3 halftime lead.

Following intermission, the away side reemerged from the locker rooms with impressive intensity. Toth provided a clinic in both positioning and braveness, blocking an excellent Empire chance with his throat as he threw himself into Stinson's first-time attempt at the doorstep. Stefan Mijatovic had set up his teammate via a clever ball off the boards. 'Keeper Toth would be left helpless on Stinson's next look, Empire's attacking ace bagging his third to make it 4-4. The Strykers continued to ride the momentum all the way to another tally, Perez giving his team the lead on a Fabián helper.

The hosts leveled things back up courtesy of a trademark Perera goal. Receiving the ball with his back to the net, the 37-year-old did well to shield it, turn on his marker, and pick out the bottom lefthand corner for his second of the contest. Toth then came up with another excellent play, as he produced a one-handed diving parry to keep out Fabián's fierce drive on a power play. However, Empire's attacking leader would not be denied moments later. Back to even numbers, the 2014 and 2018 FIFA World Cup veteran made it 5-6 by releasing a stunning long-range bullet from the yellow line.

The game's tightly contested closing quarter saw little in the way of dangerous looks until Strykers defender Mo Alewine came up with a late last-ditch sliding tackle to block away what seemed like a sure strike by Alessandro Canale. To the Stars' credit, they refused to give up and rewarded themselves with the dramatic equalizer at just over two minutes to play. Acting as a sixth attacker, netminder Toth took a shot from the top of the arc that replays appeared to show was touched over the line by Tyler John.

Things would go from bad to worse for Empire when Tacoma's Kyle Rivers bagged the winning goal with just over a minute and a half left to play. The 26-year-old took full advantage of a breakway opportunity by playing a perfect wall pass to himself and streaking down the field for a one-on-one against 'keeper Gomez, who had little chance to stop the cool finish inside the far post. The hosts did well to prevent any dangerous Strykers looks in the remaining moments, holding on for a dramatic 7-6 victory.


