DREAM BOWL WEEKEND RETURNS TO VIRGINIA'S BLUE RIDGE

Milltown, NJ -- Cutting Edge Sports Management, hosts of Dream Bowl Weekend, is pleased to announce that this year's nationally recognized events, Dream Bowl VII and the HBCU Spirit of America Bowl, will be returning to Virginia's Blue Ridge during Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Weekend.

The Dream Bowl has seen multiple players drafted and signed to NFL contracts including Grambling WR Chester Rogers (Colts), and Central Arkansas CB Tremon Smith (Chiefs). The Dream Bowl has also sent over 100 players to NFL camps, with other former players on rosters in the CFL, Europe, and Arena Leagues. The weekend will allow the best athletes to showcase their talents for the chance to play professionally at the next level with many NFL and CFL scouts in attendance. The games and the series of events held over Martin Luther King Weekend is a celebration of the excellence, commitment, and sacrifice made by the players and their families.

Special events this year along with the two all-star games include two awards banquets at the Holiday Inn-Tanglewood and two pro-style combines, where fans can see the NFL stars of tomorrow in Virginia's Blue Ridge. Cutting Edge recently announced that Coach Stephanie Balochko of the Pittsburgh Steelers will be coaching in the Dream Bowl making her the first female coach in a non-FBS all-star game.
