THE LEAGUE

In just its second ever season of play, Major Arena Soccer League Women has mushroomed to 24 teams, including 18 teams returning from the league's inaugural season, and six new clubs, representing teams in Canada, the United States and Mexico. It is only the second time ever in the MASL pyramid of that all three countries in North America have been represented under the MASL banner.



Two of the teams in the Great Lakes North – Detroit City FC, and the Youngstown Nighthawks were members last year. Detroit City, in fact, turned in a perfect 10-0 season and advanced to the league's first-ever championship game, where they fell to the Chihuahua Savage. New in the GLN is a Canadian entry, FC Berlin, which is based in Kitchener, Ontario Canada.

Many eyes will be on the Great Lakes South, where all four teams finished with better than .500 records last season. That includes the Cincinnati Sirens who won the regular season with an 8-2 record. Nipping at their heels all season were the Louisville Triumph, Columbus Eagles, and Akron based Susserfuss Ballveiren, who all return.

The Heartland five teams returning, including all three based in one of most iconic indoor soccer markets in the country, Wichita. The ICT Aztecs were the regular season division winners in 2024-25, and they are joined again this year by the Wichita Aero and Wichita Lady Luck, sister team to the MASL 2 Wichita

Wings. Also back is the Side FC Cyclones (OKC Oblivion last season) and the Tulsa FC Channel Cats, joined by a second Oklahoma City area team this winter, the OKC Ghosts.

Teams will play a 10-game regular season schedule with a national playoffs to conclude the season next spring at a site to be determined.



Austin 512 FC at Texas Lone Star

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: These two teams played last weekend in Austin, with Texas Lone Star getting the win in overtime. Lone Star held a 4-1 lead well into the final quarter, before the Austin offense exploded for three goals in the last four minutes of regulation. Jordan Gillespie and Sofia Ochoa scored in the shootout, and goalkeeper Adria Hardy saved both of Austin's attempt to secure the win. They also played January 11 with Texas taking an 11-8 slugfest. Texas Lone Star was looking for some offense, having scored just four goals in its previous two games, and found it in a big way to entertain their big home crowd in grabbing their second win of the season. The Dallas based team built a 7-3 lead at intermission and Austin never got closer than three the rest of the way. Alyssa Daily led the offensive reboot with three goals and one assist while Jocelyn Gonzalez had a hat trick. Jordan Colbert and Daniela Porto each added a goal and one assist and Taylor Torres notched two assists. Terrie Tchoffo got the win in goal. Savannah Schutt led the Austin attack with two goals and an assist. Arianni Hudge also contributed with a goal and one assist.

>> GAME NOTES: Lone Star comes in with a record of 3-2 with a goal differential of minus 6 on 24 goals scored and 30 allowed. Austin is 2-4-1 with 38 goals scored and 47 surrendered for a minus 9 differential in goals.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Sofia Ochoa is a standout player from Mexico, with extensive national and international experience. The recent signee paid dividends getting the game winning goal in a shootout last week. Jordan Colbert is the team's leading scorer with five goals and two assists. For Austin, Jaycie Bass is their leading scorer with five goals and three assists. She was a standout for the San Antonio Slayers last year, who are taking a year off from MASL W play. Morgan Seeliger also has five goals as well.

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: These two teams played January 3 in OKC, with the Aero coming out with an 8-4 win. The Aero – who were winless in 2024-25 – continued their impressive turnaround and improved to 3-2 in this one by breaking a 3-3 second half tie with four unanswered goals. Madalyn Liebst led the way with her hat trick, including the game winner with 5:03 to play in the third. Erica Boleski added two goals for the Aero, who got a strong effort in goal from Carla Apodaca who got the win. Side FC's Kayleigh Haywood led the Cyclones with a goal and one assist.

>> GAME NOTES: The Cyclones come in at 1-5 with a goal differential of minus 26 on 26 goals scored and 52 given up. They won their first game of the season last weekend against cross-town rivals the OKC Ghosts by a 5-2 score. The Aero are 4-3 with a plus five goal differential with 38 goals scored and 33 surrendered.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Emma Koepp continues her strong play for Wichita with a team leading eight goals and team best 10 points. Ali Heitoff leads the teams in assists with four. For the Cyclones, Dina Der Vartanian leads OKC with five goals.

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: These two teams have already met twice this year, with the talented Demon Hawks holding a 26-3 advantage in total goals. On Dec. 28 in Cedar Rapids, the Hawks took a 15-1 decision in the season opener for the Demon Hawks who served notice in the offseason that they were serious about a 2025-26 championship run, signing some of the top talent from the champion Chihuahua Savage, including the league's leading scorer last year in Silvia Castillo who in 10 games played in the regular season, had 27 goals and 13 assists. She also scored three goals in two playoff wins. Her Chihuahua teammate Valerie Macias joined her in Iowa this year. She had 13 goals and 14 assists in the regular season and came up big in the postseason with five goals. Both came up big again in the season opener for the Demon Hawks, as Castillo had five goals and Macias three goals and two assists. Martha Saenz had a goal and three assists. She also played for Chihuahua last year. Lilly Overstreet had two goals and one assist. She had 11 points in three regular season games last year for the Demon Hawks, who advanced to the league semi-finals. On February 1, also in Cedar Rapids, the Demon Hawks came out on top 11-2. The Demon Hawks, built a 7-1 lead at the break against the Raptors, searching for their first win in seven tries now. Castillo had a hat trick and teammate Andrea Gallegos had a goal and three assists. Brissa Valadez added two assists for the Hawks. Alondra Tinajero got the win in goal.

>> GAME NOTES: The Demon Hawks are first in the Midwest at 5-0, just ahead of the KS Astras at 5-1. They have a goal differential of plus 44 with 60 goals scored and just 16 surrendered. The Raptors are winless in eight starts and have scored 20 goals and allowed 87 for a goal differential of minus 67.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Madisyn Hunt is the Raptors leading player this year with six goals and two assists. Silvia Castillo has led the Hawks offense with 14 goals and five assists. Valeria Macias is second on the team in goals with 10.
