THE LEAGUE

In just its second ever season of play, Major Arena Soccer League Women has mushroomed to 24 teams, including 18 teams returning from the league's inaugural season, and six new clubs, representing teams in Canada, the United States and Mexico. It is only the second time ever in the MASL pyramid of that all three countries in North America have been represented under the MASL banner.



Two of the teams in the Great Lakes North – Detroit City FC, and the Youngstown Nighthawks were members last year. Detroit City, in fact, turned in a perfect 10-0 season and advanced to the league's first-ever championship game, where they fell to the Chihuahua Savage. New in the GLN is a Canadian entry, FC Berlin, which is based in Kitchener, Ontario Canada.

Many eyes will be on the Great Lakes South, where all four teams finished with better than .500 records last season. That includes the Cincinnati Sirens who won the regular season with an 8-2 record. Nipping at their heels all season were the Louisville Triumph, Columbus Eagles, and Akron based Susserfuss Ballveiren, who all return.

The Heartland five teams returning, including all three based in one of most iconic indoor soccer markets in the country, Wichita. The ICT Aztecs were the regular season winners in 2024-25, and they are joined again this year by the Wichita Lady Luck, sister team to the MASL Wichita



Wings. Also back is the Side FC Cyclones (OKC Oblivion last season) and the Tulsa FC Channel Cats, joined by a second Oklahoma City area team this winter, the OKC Ghosts.

Teams will play a 10-game regular season schedule with a national playoffs to conclude the season next spring at a site to be determined.



Dallas RPFC at Austin 512 FC

>> **PREVIOUS MEETINGS:** These two teams played on December 31 with RPFC recording a 7-3 win in Austin. Austin put up a spirited effort, getting as close as three in the final quarter after RPFC was up four at the break. Taylor Tufts scored twice and Arianna Arboleda had a goal and one assist. Also for RPFC, Mitzy Guereca had two assists. Courtney Burnette got the win in goal. Jaycie Bass, a league standout last year for the San Antonio Slayers who are sitting out this season, led the Austin effort with her two goals.

>> **GAME NOTES:** RPFC, who was in the MASL postseason last year after a 9-1 regular season, is 4-0 in 2025-26, atop the South Division. They have scored 43 goals and given up only 9 for a differential of plus 34. Austin is 2-3 with a differential of just minus 3 on 33 goals scored and 36 given up. They are currently third in the south.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Dallas RPFC is being led by Taylor Tufts who has 10 goals and four assists to date. Bria Williams is second on the team with seven goals. Kenne Kessler, who was one of the league's best players last year, has only dressed for one game so far in 2025-26 ... For Austin. Arianni Hodge is off to a hot start with nine goals and two assists. Morgan Seeliger is second on the team in goals with five. Jaycie Bass had two goals for Austin in their first matchup with RPFC.

>> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: These two teams have already played twice this year on back to back weekend in early December. The Astras won both, 8-4 on the road on Dec. 6 and 12-2 at home on Dec. 13. On Dec. 6, the Astras picked up their first win in their first ever game, jumping to a 5-1 lead at the intermission and cruising from there. Nichole Hemingson-Alves got the game winner on a two-on-one break late in the second quarter, slotting a shot to the far post. Brooke Collins got the win in goal. Nina Sanchez led the Raptors (0-1) with two goals. On Dec. 13, Emily Carrasco led the way with four goals and Valeria Mendivil had two goals and one assist.

>> GAME NOTES: The Astras are in second place at 2-1 in the Midwest, chasing the 4-0 Iowa Demon Hawks. KS has a goal differential of plus 35 with 49 scored and just 14 surrendered. The Raptors are winless in five starts, and have a goal differential of minus 42 with 13 goals scored and 55 allowed.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Emily Carrasco is one of the more dangerous target forwards in the league, and in the two games against Iowa, had eight goals scored and two assists. Goaltenders Sarah Bross and Brooke Collins often share time in goal as anchors of a strong defensive side as well... Iowa has had trouble finding the back of the net. Madisyn Hunt has been their best up front with four goals on the season.

>> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: These two played last weekend in Columbus with the Eagles taking a defensive battle, 3-2. Loren Gormley scored two first quarter goals for the Eagles, and Sam Buck got the winner just three minutes into the second half which proved to be the last goal either team would score on the night. Susserfuss held a 22-20 edge in shots, but both goaltenders stood tall, including winner Brianna Rodgers who made 11 saves.

Annabelle Hegeman was the tough luck loser, stopping 17.

>> GAME NOTES: These two teams often play tight, low-scoring games, so on paper this an interesting matchup, even though Susserfuss is seeking its first win of the season. They are in last place in the Great Lake South with a 0-5 record with 14 goals scored and 38 allowed for a minus 24 differential. Columbus is 2-3, third in the division, with a goal differential of minus 2 with 31 goals scored and 33 given up.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Although she was held off the scoresheet last weekend, Alivia Milesky is one of the top forwards in MASL W, and has nine goals on the season so far for the Eagles. Sam Buck has matched her output, however, with nine goals as well. She is a native of Reynoldsburg in suburban Columbus, and played in college at Ohio Dominican where in 84 games she scored 35 goals ... Susserfuss will look to Alexa Langenfeld who leads the team in goals with three.

>> PREVIOUS MEETINGS: This is the first meeting of the season between the two teams.

>> GAME NOTES: The Ghosts, a first-year club, have played well at times in 2025-26, so getting that first win, even against a top team like the Aztecs, can't be ruled out. OKC is 0-5 on the year, but with some close and competitive losses, and has a goal differential of minus 24 with 28 goals scored and 52 allowed. ICT was 9-1 last year, and is perfect in four starts this season with 47 goals scored and 18 allowed, a differential of plus 29.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: ICT's balanced offense includes Lexi Clark with six goals and five assists, Dora Gallo with five goals and three assists and Makayla Morgan with six goals and two helpers ... For the Ghosts, they too have a trio of top scorers revealing themselves, including Caitlyn Hirst with five goals and four assists, Kira Copeland with four goals and three assists and Alexis Davis who leads the team in goals with six.

Wichita held the Cyclones off the board until just two seconds to play in the third quarter, and at that point, had scored seven of their own to earn a split of home weekend games. Wichita held a 23-11 edge in shots with Halley Ostrander getting the win in goal, splitting time with Juliette Elliot. Five different players had multi-point games for the Luck, led by Caleigh Carpenter with two goals and one assist and Avery McCrory with a goal and two assists. Emma Kolbe scored twice, and teammates Andrea Vielmas and Kaleigh Shamburger chipped in with a goal and an assist each. Nicci Miller had two goals for OKC and Cammy Hargrove had a goal and one assist.

>> GAME NOTES: Wichita is tied with the Aztecs in points for first in the Heartland Division with 12 each, but the Lady Luck are 4-2 and ICT is 4-0. The Lady Luck have a goal differential of plus five on 36 scored and 31 given up. OKC is winless in four starting, and has scored 17 goals and given up 43 for a differential of minus 26.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Caleigh Carpenter has proven to be Wichita's top offensive threat with five goals and four assists. Emma Kolbe has two goals and three assists... For OKC Aubrey Smith and Dina Der Vartanian lead the team in goals with three each.

Last season, Houston won both matchups, including an 11-5 win and a 17-0 whitewash with the Bolt holding a 39-6 advantage in shots on goal. Alexis Espino got the clean sheet. This year, the Bolt are 2-4, having gone 1-3 in back to back doubleheaders recently against Atletico Monterrey. They have scored 31 goals and allowed 50 for a differential of minus 19. HIC is 0-4 with 14 goals scored and 32 let in.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** The Bolt's offensive leader has been Monica Aguirre with six goals and one assist. Natalee Henry has added five goals and Nicole Henry four... for HIC, Sally Palmer has been their biggest threat with four scores and teammate Miranda Carrasco has three.

Cincinnati erased an early deficit and cruised to the win. Mikayla Woods couldn't be contained as she scored four goals to lead the Sirens attack. Lauren Donovan had three assists and Kelsey Keown had two goals and one assist. Katrina Johnson was the winning netminder. Allie Rowe had two goals for FC Berlin.

>> GAME NOTES: This a Great Lakes crossover game, pitting two of the best teams on either side, up against each other for the second time in 2025-26. FC Berlin already has win over Detroit City FC, and is 4-2 on the season with 48 goals scored and 27 allowed for a plus 21 goal differential. Cincinnati is 3-1 in the GLS, with 23 scored and 14 surrendered for a plus 9 goals differential.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Ally Rowe is tops in the league so far this year with 15 goals, and she has four teammates that all have 10 points in 2025-26: Alessia De Silva (5G, 5A), Angelika Mihalopulos (3G, 7A), Brianne Desa (8G, 2A) and Hope Windebank (2G, 8A)... Cincinnati is being paced by Mikayla Woods with seven goals and one assist. Kelsey Keown has three goals and four assists. Lauren Donovan is also a dangerous playmaker with four assists.

Silvia Castillo came up big in the season opener for the Demon Hawks as she had five goals and Valeria Macias three goals and two assists. Martha Saenz had a goal and three assists. She also played for Chihuahua last year. Lilly Overstreet had two goals and one assist. She had 11 points in three regular season games last year for the Demon Hawks, who advanced to the league semi-finals.

>> GAME NOTES: Not surprisingly, with their influx of talent, everyone is chasing the Demon

Hawks in the Midwest, as they come in at 4-0 with 49 goals scored and 14 allowed for a goal differential of plus 35. For Raptors game notes and players to watch, see game above.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** The Demon Hawks served notice in the offseason that they were serious about a 2025-26 championship run, signing some of the top talent from the champion Chihuahua Savage, including the league's leading scorer last year in Silvia Castillo, who in 10 games played in the regular season, had 27 goals and 13 assists. She also scored three goals in two playoff wins. Her Chihuahua teammate Macias joined her in Iowa this year. She had 13 goals and 14 assists in the regular season and came up big in the postseason with five goals.

The other three undefeateds so far are the Iowa Demon Hawks, Dallas RPFC and Louisville Triumph, and four of the five are in action this weekend. Tulsa (3-0) was just 2-8 overall last season. They have a current goal differential of plus 20 on 33 goals scored and 13 allowed. They had a season goal differential of minus 40 last winter. For Wichita game notes and players to watch, see above. The Lady Luck took wins of 10-4 and 10-3 over Tulsa last season.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Asha Haile has helped lead the Tulsa resurgence as she leads the team with six goals, after scoring several all last year. Two teammates have four goals and three assists each coming into action this weekend: Madeleine Barone and Annie Sohmer. Barone played high school soccer at Bishop Kelly in Tulsa. Sohmer, although from Texas, is a local product as well as she played collegiately at Tulsa University, where she majored in mechanical engineering.

Emily Juarez opened the scoring for Texas with 4:09 to play in the first half, and quickly added her second just over two minutes later in a “wallscora” play from Lauren Crimi. Juarez got her third point of the night assists on a goal by Alyssa Daily just over five minutes into the third with Jordan Colbert closing out the Lone Star scoresheet with 8:47 to play on a direct free kick. Houston (0-1) actually opened the scoring with two goals in the game's first three minutes, one from Miranda Carrasco and the other by Isabella Marinaro, before the Texas defense slammed the door the rest of the way. Goalkeeper Mariana Gonzalez also delivered a strong performance, anchoring the defense and making crucial saves throughout the match to maintain the Lone Star lead.

>> GAME NOTES: It's been a minute – weather has caused many postponements across the MASL family of leagues this winter – since Lone Star has taken to the turf, with their last game on January 10, and 11-8 win over visiting Austin 512 FC. Texas is 2-1 with a goal differential of minus 6 with 15 goals scored and 21 allowed, most of them in a loss to RPFC who has one regular season loss in the last two years of MASL W action. For HIC games notes and players to watch, see above.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: Adriana “La Pulga” Calzadillas joined the club earlier this month and is expected to be a big contributor. Alyssa Daily is off to a good start for Lone Star as well, with a team-high four goals. Emily Juarez has played just once, but had three points in the win over HIC to start the season.
