THE LEAGUE

In just its second ever season of play, Major Arena Soccer League Women has mushroomed to 24 teams, including 18 teams returning from the league's inaugural season, and six new clubs, representing teams in Canada, the United States and Mexico. It is only the second time ever in the MASL pyramid of that all three countries in North America have been represented under the MASL banner.



Two of the teams in the Great Lakes North – Detroit City FC, and the Youngstown Nighthawks were members last year. Detroit City, in fact, turned in a perfect 10-0 season and advanced to the league's first-ever championship game, where they fell to the Chihuahua Savage. New in the GLN is a Canadian entry, FC Berlin, which is based in Kitchener, Ontario Canada.

Many eyes will be on the Great Lakes South, where all four teams finished with better than .500 records last season. That includes the Cincinnati Sirens who won the regular season with an 8-2 record. Nipping at their heels all season were the Louisville Triumph, Columbus Eagles, and Akron based Susserfuss Ballveiren, who all return.

The Heartland five teams returning, including all three based in one of most iconic indoor soccer markets in the country, Wichita. The ICT Aztecs were the regular season division winners in 2024-25, and they are joined again this year by the Wichita Aero and Wichita Lady Luck, sister team to the MASL 2 Wichita

Wings. Also back is the Side FC Cyclones (OKC Oblivion last season) and the Tulsa FC Channel Cats, joined by a second Oklahoma City area team this winter, the OKC Ghosts.

Teams will play a 10-game regular season schedule with a national playoffs to conclude the season next spring at a site to be determined.



ICT Aztecs at Wichita Aero

>> **PREVIOUS GAMES:** The Aztecs and Aero have played once this year on January 17 with the Aztecs taking an 11-4 win. The Aztecs continue to roll in the Heartland as they got two goals each from three different players in Maria Stephens, Kaylee Swanson and Allison Worley. Swanson also picked up an assist. Lexi Clark had one goal and one assist and Jessica Miller added two assists. ICT has lost just once in their two years of MASL W play during the regular season, posting a 9-1 mark in 2024-25. The improved Aero saw their record go level at 3-3. Omina Thompson led the way with a goal and one assist. The Aero got the game's first goal before ICT reeled off seven in a row to eventually lead at the break, 8-2.

>> **GAME NOTES:** The Aztecs are already through the MASL W playoffs in Detroit on March 20-22, so this will be a post-season tune up game, and a game that will help determine their seed in the post-season. At 8-0, they have won the Heartland Division regular season title, and ICT has a goal differential of plus 60 on 87 goals scored and 27 surrendered. The Aero, after going just 2-8 last year, are 5-3 with a plus 12 goals differential with 50 scored and just 38 given up.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Makayla Morgan has been impressive upfront with 15 goals and three assists. Jessica Miller leads ICT in assists, and is first in the league in that category,

with 10. They spread the offense out with an impressive seven different players with 10 or more total points this season. For the Aero, Emma Koepp has led the team's resurgence with 10 goals and three assists. Madalyn Liebst is second in scoring with six goals and four assists.

>> **PREVIOUS GAMES:** These two teams played just last weekend in Omaha with the Queens taking a 7-5 win. It was the first of two played already this year, with the Astras taking a 9-6 win earlier in February. Last Saturday, Tori Von Mende broke a 5-5 tie with just under 11 minutes to go in the final quarter, and that held up as the game winner as the host Queens scored the last three goals of the game. The game was tied on five different occasions, and the Queens never led until Von Mende's winner. Mia Hurt led the way for Omaha with three goals while Mayme Conroy had two. Sienna Phelps was credited with the win in goal. Chloe Lawrence and Thayline Teixeira each scored twice for the Astras. On Feb 7, less than three minutes into the second quarter, it was the Queens on a huge roll, building up a 5-1 lead. But past that point, it was all Astras as they allowed just one more Omaha goal the rest of the way, and their offense came to life. Chloe Lawrence broke a 6-6 tie just 21 seconds into the final quarter to get the game winner. Kansas spread the offense around, with five different players having two-point nights: Megan Snyder and Thayline Teixeira scored two goals each, Lawrence and Avery Woods had a goal and an assist each, and Laura Torres had two assists. For Omaha, Erionelle Clifton had two goals and two assists and Mayme Conroy had two goals and one assist. Sarah Bross got the win in goal.

>> **GAME NOTES:** Both teams still entertain post-season hopes, with the Astras currently in second in the Midwest Division with a 5-2 mark. They have scored 57 goals and allowed 30 for a plus 27 goal differential. Omaha is 3-3 with a goal differential of minus 4 with 44

scored and 48 surrendered.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Emily Carassco is one of the league's best finishers and has 14 goals and six assists for 20 points for the Astras. Avery Woods and Chloe Lawrence are tied for second on the team in goals with six each. For Omaha, Mia Hurt has been their best with 14 goals and two assists. Mayme Conroy has eight goals and three assists.

>> **PREVIOUS GAMES:** These two teams have played three times already this year, and the Demon Hawks are 3-0, outscoring the Raptors 42-5. On Feb. 14, the Hawks scored a 16-2 home win. Almost unbelievably, the game was tied 2-2 at the half, but the Demon Hawks erupted for 14 unanswered goals in the final two quarters to stay undefeated. The Hawks held a 26-4 advantage in shots. Silvia Castillo, who led the league in scoring last season, had six goals. Lily Overstreet had a hat trick and Martha Saenz had two goals and one assist. Andrea Gallegos also scored two. Savannah Stout and Paige Beaudry were the Raptors goal getters. Alondra Tinajero got the win in net. On Feb. 1 in Cedar Rapids, the host Raptors fell 11-2. The Demon Hawks built a 7-1 lead at the break against the Raptors, searching for their first win in seven tries now. Silvia Castillo had a hat trick and teammate Andrea Gallegos had a goal and three assists. Brissa Valadez added two assists for the Hawks. Alondra Tinajero got the win in goal. On Dec. 28, also in Cedar Rapids, the Demon Hawks won 15-1. The Demon Hawks served notice in the offseason that they were serious about a 2025-26 championship run, signing some of the top talent from the champion Chihuahua Savage, including the league's leading scorer last year in Silvia Castillo, who in 10 games played in the regular season, had 27 goals and 13 assists. She also scored three goals in two playoff wins. Her Chihuahua teammate Valerie Macias joined her in Iowa this year. She had 13 goals and 14 assists in the regular season and came up big in the postseason with five goals. Both came up big again in the season opener for the Demon Hawks, as Castillo had five goals and Macias three goals and two assists. Martha Saenz had a goal and three assists. She also played for Chihuahua last year. Lily Overstreet had two goals and one

assist. She had 11 points in three regular season games last year for the Demon Hawks, who advanced to the league semi-finals.

>> **GAME NOTES:** The Demon Hawks, with some of the top talent from last year's championship team in Chihuahua have dominated the Midwest with a 6-0 mark with 76 goals scored and 18 allowed for a plus 58 goal differential. The Raptors are 0-9 with a goal differential of minus 81 with 22 goals scored and 103 given up.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Silvia Castillo leads the Demon Hawks with 20 goals and five assists. Lily Overstreet and Valeria Macias are tied for second on the team in goals with 10 each. For the Raptors, Madisyn Hunt leads the team with six goals.

The Sirens outshot the hosts, 24-13. Cincinnati led 3-0 at the break and was led by Mackenzie Kent with two goals and one helper. Jackie Esterkamp contributed with a goal and one assist as well.

>> **GAME NOTES:** Both of these teams are solid, fundamental sides that don't usually get into offensive shootouts. The Sirens are battling for a post-season berth and come in 5-1-1 with a goal differential of plus 13 with 32 goals scored and 19 given up. Columbus is 3-5 with a minus 5 differential on 48 scored and 53 goals allowed.

>> **GAME NOTES:** Detroit is tuning up for its role as host, and one of the favorites, for the MASL W playoffs which will be contested March 20-22 at the Detroit City Fieldhouse. They come in with a mark of 6-2 with 73 goals scored and 41 allowed for a goal differential of plus 23. Youngstown is a very young team that struggles to find the net, with a goal differential of minus 82 with just 20 goals scored and 102 surrendered.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Megan Verant and Erin Torrence have led Detroit's multi-pronged attack. Verant leads with 11 goals this year, and Torrence has nine. Kayla Addison and Mackenzie Rueber have seven each and Hannah Crum and Katie Coleman six each. For Youngstown, Mia Williams has four goals in six appearances in 2025-26.

Karen Esparza got the lone Austin score. On February 7, Texas won in Austin, 5-4. Overtime wasn't enough to settle this one as Texas Lone Star had to go to a shootout to get the win against Austin 512 FC. Sofia Ochoa and Jordan Gillespie each converted their shootouts to secure the win while goalkeeper Terrie Tchoffo made two stops in the tiebreaker. Austin rallied from a 4-1 deficit with three goals in the game's final four minutes. Jordan Colbert scored twice for Lone Star while Jaycie Bass had a goal and

two assists for Austin. And on January 10, Lone Star took an 11-8 slugfest from 512 FC.
