THE LEAGUE

In just its second ever season of play, Major Arena Soccer League Women has mushroomed to 24 teams, including 18 teams returning from the league's inaugural season, and six new clubs, representing teams in Canada, the United States and Mexico. It is only the second time ever in the MASL pyramid of that all three countries in North America have been represented under the MASL banner.



Two of the teams in the Great Lakes North – Detroit City FC, and the Youngstown Nighthawks were members last year. Detroit City, in fact, turned in a perfect 10-0 season and advanced to the league's first-ever championship game, where they fell to the Chihuahua Savage. New in the GLN is a Canadian entry, FC Berlin, which is based in Kitchener, Ontario Canada.

Many eyes will be on the Great Lakes South, where all four teams finished with better than .500 records last season. That includes the Cincinnati Sirens who won the regular season with an 8-2 record. Nipping at their heels all season were the Louisville Triumph, Columbus Eagles, and Akron based Susserfuss Ballveiren, who all return.

The Heartland five teams returning, including all three based in one of most iconic indoor soccer markets in the country, Wichita. The ICT Aztecs were the regular season division winners in 2024-25, and they are joined again this year by the Wichita Aero and Wichita Lady Luck, sister team to the MASL 2 Wichita

Wings. Also back is the Side FC Cyclones (OKC Oblivion last season) and the Tulsa FC Channel Cats, joined by a second Oklahoma City area team this winter, the OKC Ghosts.

Teams will play a 10-game regular season schedule with a national playoffs to conclude the season next spring at a site to be determined.

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: This is the second meeting of the season, with the team meeting on January 7 with the Bolt taking a 7-5 win. The Bolt opened their 2025-25 season in dramatic fashion, breaking a 4-4 tie with three goals in the game's final five minutes to secure the victory. Allie Byrd, netting her second of the night, got the game winner with three minutes to play. Austin's Arianna Hudge scored with just a minute to go, but Kendall Kowen closed out the scoring just seconds later to provide the two-goal margin. Rebekah O'Brien also had two goals for Houston while teammate Alexis Espino got the win in goal. Leading the way for Austin was Hudge who had the hat trick. Charlene Mendoza had the other two Austin markers.

>> GAME NOTES: This is the final regular season game for the Houston Bolt, who could finish at .500 with a win as they come in a 4-5. They have a goal differential of minus 11 with 48 scored and 59 allowed. For Austin, they have a record of 2-5-1 with a minus 15 goals differential with 39 goals scored and 54 given up.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: For Houston, **Monica Aguirre** has been their leading scorer with eight goals and two assists. **Natalee Henry** has six goals this year as well. For Austin, **Jaycie Bass** has eight point including five goals and three assists in six starts.

>> **GAME NOTES:** The two teams will likely determine the outcome of the South Division in the next two weekends, as they matchup for a pair in Mexico this weekend, and will then follow that up next weekend with two against each other in Dallas. RPFC is in first with 15 points and a record of 5-0 so far this year. They have a goal differential of plus 39 with 49 scored and just 10 given up. Monterrey is in third in the division with just five games played, with a record of 4-1. They have a goal differential of plus 16 with 40 scored and 24 allowed.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** **Taylor Tufts**, in her MASL W debut, has been find, leading the offesne for RPFC with 11 goals and four assists. **Bria Williams** is second on the team in goals scoring with seven while **Fernanda Sarellano** is second on the team in overall points with six goals and five assists. For Monterrey, **Susana Silva** has been a force with 11 goals and two assists. **Evelyn Gonzalez** is second on the team in goals with seven.

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: This is the second meeting of the season between the two teams. They played at SIG Sportsplex on Feb. 7 with the Astras getting a 9-6 win. Less than three minutes into the second quarter, it was the Queens on a huge roll, building up a 5-1 lead. But past that point, it was all Astras as they allowed just one more Omaha goal the rest of the way, and their offense came to life. Chloe Lawrence broke a 6-6 tie just 21 seconds into the final quarter to get the game winner. Kansas spread the offense around, with five different players having two-point nights: Megan Snyder and Thayline Teixeira scored two goals each, Lawrence and Avery Woods had a goal and an assist each, and Laura Torres had two assists. For Omaha, Erionelle Clifton had two goals and two assists and Mayme Conroy had two goals and one assist. Sarah Bross got the win in goal.

>> GAME NOTES: The Astras, at 5-1, are three points behind the Iowa Demon Hawks who are 6-0. They have 52 goals scored and 23 allowed for a plus 29 goal differential. Omaha is 2-3 to date with a minus 6 goal differential with 37 scored and 43 given up.

>> PLAYERS TO WATCH: **Emily Carrasco** has been great this year, with 14 goals and 6 assists for the Astras. **Avery Woods** is second on the team in goals with eight. **Mia Hurt** is averaging over two points a game, with 11 goals and two assists in five Omaha starts. **Mayme Conroy** is second on the team in goals with six.

>> PREVIOUS GAMES: This is the second meeting of the season. Columbus traveled to Youngstown on Jan. 3 and came back to the state's capital with a 17-3 win. Columbus (broke into the win column for the first time in 2025-26, knocking in four goals in the game's first 11 minutes to take control early. Alivia Milesky led the attack with five goals, while Sam Buck had a hat trick. Contributing two goals each were Avery Bowden, Angela Boyce and Megan Hersey. Liv Alford was the winning goaltender. Mia Williams, Abby Markey and Maylee Nadaud were the Youngstown (0-1) goal getters.

>> GAME NOTES: Columbus is just 2-5 on the season, with a goal differential of minus 14 on

38 goals scored and 52 surrendered. Youngstown, which plays in the Great Lakes North this year, is 1-5 with just 19 goals scored and 92 surrendered for a minus 73 goal differential.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Mia Williams has scored four goals to lead the Nighthawks. Sam Buck with 10 goals and Alivia Milesky with nine pace the Columbus offense.

>> **GAME NOTES:** Tulsa has been improved from their 2024-25 debut when they won just twice, but it's been a bit of a roller coaster. They opened 2025-26 with four straight wins, and then lost four straight, to stand at 4-4. Their goal differential is as tight as their record at just minus 1 with 55 scored and 56 allowed. The Cyclones are 1-6 with 31 goals scored and 64 surrendered for a minus 33 differential.

>> **PLAYERS TO WATCH:** Tulsa's top performers include Madeleine Barone with six goals and five assists, and three players with 10 points each: Annie Sohmer (4G, 6A), Asha Haile (10G, 0A) and Renee Wilson (5G, 5A). OKC is being paced on offense by Dina Der Vartanian, their leading goal scorer with five, and Karla Boydston their leading points getter with six.
