Scouting Metropolitan:

The Riveters are coming off of a 2-1-0 record overall in the 2021 shortened campaign. Due to a COVID-19 breakout within the team's roster, Metropolitan were forced to withdraw early from the protected environment at Herb Brooks Arena in Lake Placid, New York.

A class of nine newcomers joins the organization, including 3 forwards, 5 defenders, and 1 goaltender. The new additions join 10 returners from the 2021 campaign.

Metropolitan returns 3 of its top scorers from the 2021 campaign in Leila Kilduff (2-1-3), Rebecca Russo (1-1-2), and Kelly Babstock (0-2-2).

The Riveters lost a pair of young players in Cailey Hutchison, Saroya Tinker, Sammy Kolowrat, Tatiana Shatalova, Jayne Lewis, Paige Voight, Bridgette Prentiss, and Tera Hofmann.

They also lost a pair of veterans in Rebecca Morse, Kate Leary, and Kiira Dossdall-Arena.

Five PHF draftees make up Metropolitan's roster, with Romana Košecká's first-round pick (fifth overall) in the International Draft being the top selection in 2021.

Seasonal Recap:

In the shortened 2021 campaign, Metropolitan marked a 2-1-0 record, collecting their only two wins against the Toronto Six, and Connecticut Whale.

Metropolitan's seven goals on the season came by six different goal scorers, while 11 skaters earned at least one point last season, including three with multiple points.

Roster Updates:

Metropolitan returns 10 of its 21 players from the 2021 campaign, including 12 of the season's points, and one goaltender.

The Riveters add one 2021 PHF draft pick to the roster in Romana Košecká, who was selected fifth overall in the league's first-ever international draft.

Ranking third on the team last season was a nine-way tie between Theresa Knutson, Mallory Ruston, Cailey Hutchison, Emily Janiga, Saroya Tinker, Kiira Dossdall-Arena, Brooke Avery, Kate Leary and Kendall Cornine, who tallied one point each, trailing Rebecca Russo and Kelly Babstock, who collected two points each and finished in a two-way tie.

2021-22 PHF Season:

Metropolitan is 5-8-1 to open the league's seventh season, and first in the new era of the Premier Hockey Federation.

Captain Madison Packer (8-8-16) leads the team with 16 points, ahead of Kendall Cornine (9-5-14), Rebecca Russo (6-8-14), Kelly Babstock (4-7-11), Theresa Knutson (6-4-10), Kristen Barbara (0-8-8), Emily Janiga (4-3-7), Colleen Murphy (0-7-7), Rachel Ade (0-7-7), and Rose Alleva (0-4-4), who trail behind them respectively as the team's top 10 point producers.

The Riveters have collected 28 points between six of the team's nine new members, including Kristen Barbara (0-8-8), Colleen Murphy (0-7-7), Rachel Ade (0-7-7), Rose Alleva (0-4-4), Nora MacLaine (2G1A) and Haley Frade (1-0-1).

Colleen Murphy was signed on Tuesday, Nov. 30 from her professional tryout to a PHF contract for the 2021-22 season.

Brooke Wolejko has started between the pipes in nine of the team's 14 games, leading the goalie tandem with a .909 save percentage.

The series-opening contest on Dec. 11 at Canlan Sports - York marked the first of four games between the Toronto Six and Metropolitan Riveters this season.

The Riveters enter Saturday's contest against the Toronto Six seated in fourth place in the overall PHF standings with 16 points through 14 games.

Russo's Corner:

Rebecca Russo was named November PHF Player of the Month, leading the league with 9 points through four games (4G5A), while adding a plus-minus rating of +5. This includes four-straight multi-point performances, contributing to a pair of wins for the third place Riveters. At the time of recognition, Russo ranked ninth all-time in PHF scoring with 52 points in 57 games, including 22 goals.

As per Paul Krotz, PHF SVP of Communications, Rebecca's most productive outing was in the season opener on Nov. 6, scoring once with two assists as part of a 4-1 win over the Connecticut Whale.

The 27-year-old added two points on Nov. 21 in a 5-3 victory against the Buffalo Beauts. The Westport, CT native also put seven shots on goal for the second straight game.

Shining Stars In The Garden State:

Two Metropolitan Riveters players were selected to the PHF All-Star Showcase, which took place at Northtown Center on Saturday, January 29. Those selected by the league include Madison Packer and Rebecca Russo.

In her seventh year with the Riveters, and her fifth in a leadership role, Packer has tallied 16 points (8-8-16), while adding a plus/minus rating of +11.

Keeping Up With The Rivs:

Captain Madison Packer was also considered for November PHF Player of the Month, amassing eight points on four goals and four assists across the team's first four games.

Packer scored the lone Riveters goal on Saturday, Dec. 11 in a 2-1 loss to the Toronto Six, continuing an impressive production streak, tallying her fifth goal and ninth point of the 2021-22 PHF season.

Kiira Dosdall-Arena was signed on Thursday, Feb. 24 to a PHF contract for the remainder of the 2021-22 season.

Coaching Staff:

Following the departure of General Manager Kate Whitman-Annis, Anya Packer fills the vacated position, entering her first season in the front office role.

Following the departure of Assistant Coach Ashley Johnston, Kelly Nash fills the vacated position, entering her first season behind the Riveters bench.

Making Some History:

In the absence of Head Coach Ivo Mocek, who couldn't travel with the team to Toronto due to a personal matter, Associate Head Coach Kelly Nash became the first female bench boss behind the Riveters bench and the second former NWHL player to serve as Head Coach.
