



## PAMA CUP 2026 – OFFICIAL REGULATIONS

### 1. Nature of the Event

The PAMA CUP is a private, international, and independent inline hockey tournament, not affiliated with any national or international federation or any entity that follows the WADA Code. All rules, eligibility criteria, and organizational decisions are established exclusively by the PAMA CUP Organization.

### 2. Categories

The 2026 edition includes the following categories (12):

6U, 8U, 10U, 12U, 14U, 16U, 18U, 22U, 35+, Women, Legacy (Pro), Flag Cup (National Teams).

### 3. Game Rules

The PAMA CUP follows a rule format similar to all the North Americans tournaments (such as NARCH), official Ice hockey nets, with adaptations. Detailed rules will be included in the **PAMA Cup Technical Guide**.

### 4. Athlete Eligibility

Athletes from any country, club, league, or organization may participate.

Athletes suspended by any national federations including, World Skate, or WADA-related sanctions **ARE eligible**, as this is a private event and we only recognize our own suspensions. Women are allowed to play one year down. (2012 girl will be considered as a 2013 boy)

### 5. Conduct and Fair Play

All participants must maintain respectful and conduct safe conduct. Aggressive or discriminatory behavior may result in disciplinary action.

### 6. Disciplinary Code

Sanctions in the games will be determined by the rulebook, any other sanctions in the venue may include warnings, game penalties, suspensions, or removal. All decisions are final.

### 7. Anti-Doping Policy

The PAMA CUP does not follow the WADA Code. The organization may deny participation if an athlete presents a safety risk to themselves or others.

## 8. Protests and Reviews

Only head coaches may submit written protests within **30 minutes after the game**, along with a protest fee of 25 euros.

## 9. Team Registration

## 10. Insurance and Liability

The event is not responsible for injuries, accidents, or equipment loss. Athletes participate at their own risk. A Waiver must be signed before the first game.

## 11. Media and Image Rights

By participating, athletes authorize the use of photo/video images for promotion, without compensation.

## 12. Liability Waiver

Participation implies full acceptance of these regulations and acknowledgment of the private nature of the event.

## 13. Refund Policy

Cancellations are non-refundable. In force majeure, compensation methods will be determined by the organization.
